We had mass in the mornings about three times a week and on a Sunday. If you were being punished for something you were not allowed breakfast. We would then get washed. Our hair was normally brushed with a normal brush but if we were being punished our hair was brushed with a steel fine tooth comb b

  I remember many occasions between the ages of 4 and 14 when this happened and having my head pushed about and the Sister being very rough, often leaving my scalp bleeding. We then went to school. I went to primary school at Nazareth House and then I went to secondary school at We would be allowed to watch television for an hour. Then we completed our homework and went to bed about 8 o'clock. Bed time was at 6 or 7 o'clock when we were younger.
- 8. We had chores to do every day which included scrubbing the bathrooms, toilets, corridors and washing the dishes.

- 9. The food was good. However it was often withheld as a punishment. There was recreation. There was a swing outside. If it was raining there was a hall to play in where we had tricycles to ride. You got pocket money. There was a school tuck shop to spend your pocket money. Sometimes we were allowed to watch a film on a Sunday and we were given an apple to eat while watching the film. I was often punished when the films were shown and wasn't allowed to watch. We always had second hand clothes but clothes were provided. We were taken to a nearby dentist. I think we were given immunisations at school. However in other ways we were not well looked after.
- 10. When we slept in a dormitory we had metal beds with a sheet and a blanket. It was freezing cold. The dormitory was dark and scary. One form of punishment I endured was being made to stand on a dark corridor naked. There were cockroaches on the ground. I recall this happening twice when I was nine and eleven years old. I had a problem with wetting the bed. This problem persisted throughout my time in care. They would get us up in the middle of the night to go to the toilet but I still had a problem. I think it started around the time I was first raped when I was and I think it persisted as a result of the treatment I received from the nuns. In the morning I was beaten by SR 15 or SR 9 but worse than that they then humiliated the bedwetters by making us put our underwear on our head and stand at the breakfast table so everyone could see.
- 11. During my time at Nazareth House I suffered physical abuse at the hands of three nuns SR 9 SR 15 an SR 52

	with the pain. I was not taken to hospital and I received no medical treatment
	because the nuns would not have wanted questions to be asked. It took the

	Army too. They also made us distribute election leaflets for the SDLP as Sister
	SR 9 was very good friends with John Hume. We were allowed to watch TV
	and we could hear the nuns talk politics between them. The streets were
	covered in bricks so I picked one up and I threw it at the Army jeep. Sister

- 21. When we were in trouble we were made to stand in a corridor to wait for Sister SR 9 o SR 15. I remember they would put me over a table, take my pants down and hit me with a steel ruler on my backside or the back of my legs. Sister SR 52 also hit me once with a steel ruler when I was about ten years old. It was very painful and I could not sit down afterwards.
- 22. Another punishment by the nuns was to be made to have your bath last. We all used the same water. It was filthy by the time I got in and some of the girls would have had their period. I cannot have a bath to this day. I only ever shower. A bath would make me feel dirty.
- 23. During my time in Nazareth House I was also sexually abused.
- 24. During the summer we were sent to families. I remember being sent to spend the summer with the SND 171/172 family when I was either old.



I do not know how I got from the field but the next thing I remember is lying on the pavement across from the SND 1711/172 s house covered in blood. All I remember is SND 171 picking me up and carrying me to their house. SND 172 bathed me and I remember the water was red from the blood. I do not remember talking to the family about this or how I got back to Nazareth House. I did not tell anyone what happened but I was never sent to that family again. I believe that the SND 171/172 s had their suspicions and that is the reason why they never had me back again.

emotional distress. When you and I was asked to see you,
you told me how unhappy you were in the Nazareth House, but did not give me any
details. I visited the Nazareth House at that time to talk to the Sisters about your unhappiness. When
l addressed this with SR 9 she questioned why you would be so unhappy as you have a
"beautiful bedroom!" She asked a young Sister to show me your bedroom. I returned to school
aware that there was little awareness of what lay behind your unhappiness. I will never forget that
visit. I started in a land you would have left a few years later, and you visited
me once afterwards when you moved to

6. As I have said my was to the primary school in Derry and I was there. My normal duties were those of and I would have spent my days in I worked as these were year old children and we had classes of about 40. At the time the large class sizes meant some schools split the classes into morning and afternoon classes but as we had to manage the schooling and the residential care of the children it was not possible to split them in this way. I left Derry in

- 7. In addition to my duties I would also be required to help the sisters in the residential home with the children. That assistance would be of a supervisory nature in the morning helping get the children their breakfast and then out to their various schools. In the evening I would assist with extra-curricular activities and home work. The sister in charge of each group would have been the main sister and she would have co-ordinated things and I would be there to help out. At no time did I work in nor did I work in St Joseph's Children's Home, Termonbacca.
- 8. I would have helped out after school by walking the Termonbacca boys up to the bus stop at Abercorn Road to get the bus back. The buses refused to come closer to the school because of a fear of being hijacked. I recall an incident when I was approached by a man telling me to move the children so that they could get a line of sight to fire on the army. I told them to go away as the children needed to go home and they needed to get the bus. The man left and there was no shooting anywhere near the children.
- 9. My memory of the children generally is that they came from a number of different backgrounds. Some were orphans, some came from families who could not, for many reasons, cope and provide for them. Some came from the nursery in Fahan, others from the nursery in Bishop Street and others came from their families who for many reasons could not care for them.
- I do not recall any incidents of a child being abused. I recall SR 9 who was responsible for discipline in the home and also in the school. She was very strict but was also fair. The usual punishments I recall are of being refused an activity like music or dancing or of pocket money being with held. I never remember any occasion when a child left SR 9 office and ever said they had been slapped or beaten. They were upset if they had been punished and some may have felt it was unfair because they did not think they were to blame but none ever said they had been slapped or beaten.

## HIA 90

11. I have seen the statement provided by HIA 90 and there are some simple inaccuracies in this statement. She refers to being sent downstairs from the nursery to the junior dormitory. The dormitory was upstairs from the nursery unit until the when the unit was converted into smaller family units. I do recall SND 50 and I

remember SND 51 SND 51 attended the Mass for the closing of the house on Bishop Street

- 12. She says that she recalls going to Mass every day. That would not have been normal practice for the children. They would have gone to Mass on a Sunday and on Holy days but not every day. During Lenten season they may have been encouraged to go to Mass but they were not made to go.
- 13. She says that she had no contact with her sisters until the age of My recollection is that her sister SND 288 and would have seen her on an almost daily basis. I recall SND 288 as being small in stature but she was in her late when she was
- 14. I was not involved in making arrangements for children to be placed with families during any holidays. My recollection is that the children stayed in Nazareth House during the Christmas break and did not go to families. I remember the House at Christmas and the children going to the pantomime. I also recall visits from the Bishop and the children putting on a show for him. They would have performed music and dances they had been learning during the year. This is why I do not think the children went out to families over the Christmas break. I do not know what arrangement she is referring to about going to Mass early with two members of the host family. At that time it would have been usual for a whole family to go to Mass together so if that is not what happened I do not know why.

reported this to the Superior. I was never aware of any sexual or sexualised behaviour within the home, between peers or outside the home concerning our children. The recent revelations are the first I have seen of this type of behaviour.

- 15. If any child had returned early from a placement there would have been questions asked about why the child had returned. If they had been unhappy we would have tried to find out why.
- 16. I do not accept that this girl missed school because she was potty training the younger children. I recall the taking the younger children to her home during the day and she would have done that.
- 17. I am surprised that HIA 90 feels the nuns stopped her from doing a Child Care course. Career advice would have been within the remit of the school and not the sisters. I certainly do not recall ever being asked for my view on this course and I had no part in deciding on the future career of HIA 90 I do recall that she, among other children, changed schools as a result of the rioting and troubles in the Bogside but not for any other reason. It is possible the change of school was a reason for a change in her career choices but it was not a decision taken for any reason connected to her career as far as I am aware.

- 18. I am very surprised and upset at the allegation that I hit a child as some sort of punishment for getting hurt. I would have helped a child who was injured and cleaned a cut and put a plaster on a cut if it needed one. I deny categorically that I ever hit or beat a child which caused bruising and that to hide this I stopped the child from swimming. If the children were on a day trip we would not allow them to swim as there were so many of them and the risks to them were too great. Even then I would not be the sister in charge of the children and the decisions about swimming and so on would have been made by the sister in charge and not by me.
- 19. I do not recall anything like the story about the brick and the first time I saw such a story was in the statement provided by HIA 169 If SR 30 was driving the bus this would have been during the year I was would have been during the year I was I do not recall the girls wearing a tartan skirt as part of any school uniform. I recall a tartan skirt or kilt was worn by one of the bands who played Scottish music. I would find it hard to believe anyone would hit a child on the head with a brick and do not see Sr SR 9 as being the sort of person who would do that.
- When the unit changed and three groups were formed. I was in fact to years a sister at that stage but I will accept I may still have looked younger. I do recall the children doing chores around the house. This was partly to help out and partly as a distraction. The chores were normal household chores such as dusting, brushing and polishing. I recall a handheld polisher used with a rug or blanket thing underneath. I do recall seeing the children using the handhelp polisher but I have no memory of them using it in the hall. I have no memory of them polishing floors using their feet.
- 21. I do not recall there being scrubbing brushes in the bathrooms. I clearly recall sponges and nail brushes. I recall that each of the girls were given a packet of sanitary towels each month.
- 22. I do recall a time when there was a fear of a prowler in the dormitory at night. I recall a nursing sister who worked with the elderly residents, was attacked and an intruder tried to pull her outside. She raised the alarm and nothing serious happened. This person was not me and the sister was not raped. Because of the rumours of an intruder an alarm bell was fitted to the doors leading to the stairways and on one occasion three sisters stayed up and saw a man climbing a drainpipe. The chaplain and an off duty policeman chased and caught this man. The area was a "no go" area at the time and the police did not come out and the man was not arrested.
- 23. The children were never locked in the units. In fact I would say there were no locks on the unit doors to lock them in. The usual routine was that the children returned home from school, changed out of their uniforms, played outdoors if dry or in the hall if it was wet until the evening meal was served about 5pm.

- 24. I recall SND 477 making regular visits to see the children. I believe he would have come in every
- 25. I do not recall a large number of social workers. Only a few of the children would have had their own designated social worker as far as I can recall. The social workers would have visited the House to see the children and would have had the opportunity to speak to them privately.
- 26. I remember HIA 90 coming to visit me after she moved to to work. She married a man and unfortunately this marriage broke down and ended in divorce.
- 27. When Nazareth House celebrated its centenary I returned with a number of sisters who had been there over the years. A large number of former residents who had kept in touch were invited to join in the celebrations. I recall a very happy and joyous celebration and I do not recall anyone who was distressed or upset. No-one approached me with any concerns and everyone I spoke to were grateful for the home and were sad to see it closing after such a long time in Derry.
- 28. I was present at a meeting with Cardinal Brady and members of the various congregations. Former residents of the various houses were present and it was a difficult meeting for all concerned. On behalf of the congregation I apologised for any hurt caused to our former charges. This was an apology on behalf of the congregation and was not a personal apology or admission. The sisters have no problem in such an apology as they always wanted the best for the children and tried to provide for them as best they could. If any child felt they were mistreated or feels pain or hurt as a result of their time I happily repeat that apology.

# HIA 169

- 29. HIA 169 alleges that I hit her with my fist and also with a bunch of keys. I have never struck any child with my fist and I did not carry a bunch of keys while I was in Bishop Street. I completely deny this allegation.
- 30. She also alleges that I struck her with a steel ruler. I do not recall there ever being steel rulers or any other implement that could be mistaken for a steel ruler. The rulers in the school were all wooden. I did not teach HIA 169 nor was she in any family group I was in charge of. I completely deny this allegation.
- 31. Children who wet the bed like HIA 169 were called by the sisters before they went to bed. They were woken and they went to the toilet to try to stop bed wetting. If beds were wet the sheets were taken by the sister in the laundry and were washed during the day.

- 32. The self abuse referred to by HIA 169 was completely new to me. I had no idea about this and had never been told or this before. I did not witness anything that might have indicated this was going on.

  I do recall an incident of
  - being injured but my memory was that her sister told me she had fallen carrying a crate of milk and cut herself on the broken glass.
- I am sure she received medical treatment but I could not say anything about a cotton wool dressing as I was not involved in the treatment. I deny being involved in holding her down while such a dressing was removed in the way she describes or at all. I am sure HIA 169 sustained the injuries she has complained of and I have seen the report from the doctor and the pictures. I cannot comment on how these injuries were received other than the recollection of an incident with milk bottles I do not recall any other major incidents with HIA 169 SND 477 attended every I believe and any child who was ill or needed any care would have been seen by him. I am sure he would have treated for injuries she sustained and if he was concerned I am sure he would have made some note or comment about those injuries. I am also sure the staff at the school would have noted serious injuries and made inquiries about them.

## HIA 105

- HIA 105 describes incidents where the older girls combed her hair with a steel fine comb and that her scalp was bleeding. She says that I supervised this and took no action. I deny this. This sounds like an incident when there was an outbreak of headlice. This did happen and we did not have the treatments available today. The normal course was to wash the hair and then comb out the lice and nits using a fine comb. I recall some of the children may have had sores where they had scratched their heads and this could be a memory HIA 105 has. Many of the children came from deprived backgrounds and were unwashed or had infestations of head or body lice when they were admitted. They would have been washed and the lice combed out to try to prevent the spread. Infestations were unfortunately regular. I deny the allegation made that suggests that there was a bullying type regime which I supervised and allowed to happen. That is simply untrue. Bath nights were usually on Tuesdays and Fridays. The children's hair was washed on Saturday afternoon when I was out collecting in the Waterside. I was not involved in this routine.
- 35. I also completely deny the allegation of physical abuse and cruelty. I have never witnessed either of the two sisters identified inflict harm on any child. I do not accept that a child was ever made to eat food they had already eaten after they had been sick. The food was the best we could provide and there was no choice available. We had our meal after the children but ate the same meal cooked for them. Our dinner would be plated up and then kept warm while we supervised the children's meal time.

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36. I do remember SND 109 She went on to believe she became a but she did not maintain contact with the sisters so I am recalling what I had heard.

#### **General comments**

- 37. During my time in Derry we saw some of the worst of the troubles. There was daily rioting and shooting. Rioting was almost a pastime for young people in the area and we were anxious to keep our children away from this. I was there for the trouble around internment, Operation Motorman, Bloody Sunday among other things. Bishop Street was very close to the Bogside and the Brandywell areas and many of the children we saw in the school had seen dreadful things. We tried to protect the children in Bishop Street from the worst of these problems as best we could with the resources available to us
- 38. We were heavily dependant on the collecting sisters and donations from the diocese and Saint Vincent de Paul. Without the charity of the people of Derry, who despite the poor circumstances they found themselves in, always gave generously to the sisters. We simply could not have operated the home without their aid. Even big companies like Desmonds gave us gifts of clothes and pyjamas for the children. This charity allowed us to operate and to do what we did for the children.
- 39. When I consider all the information available now on learning difficulties, behavioural problems and the effects of family trauma I wish more had been known then. In some ways we were better off as the children were more naïve and childlike than many of our young people today. I do not doubt that some of the children with us had behavioural problems which are more readily noted and treated today. I am sure many were traumatised by the events in the streets around them.
- 40. The Sisters did all they could with the knowledge and facilities available to them at the time.
- 41. The Sisters made sure the children had the best clothing they could provide. Every child had full school uniform and non uniform clothes for play. We baked bread in Bishop Street which was swapped for potatoes and fresh food from the farm at Termonbacca. This meant the children could get a decent meal. We had to manage the resources we had as best we could.
- 42. I am aware that it is suggested we sent the children out badly dressed and they were bullied because of that. I do not accept that. We sent the children out in uniform for school. I would say they may have stood out because they had better uniform than some of those from the local community. If any child was bullied it is not acceptable. That goes for now as much as it did then.

- 43. I am also aware of allegations that the sisters ate better meals than the children. That would not be my memory. I recall eating the same meal as the children. I recall that often our food would have been kept warm while we supervised the meals eaten by the children. There was definitely not a separate meal prepared for us.
- I recall that there was always some sort of activity being organised for the children. There were dancing and music classes and the children would often perform on occasions and attend competitions. I have heard it suggested that these dancers or musicians were used like trained monkeys to make the sisters look good. This is a comment I find very hurtful. The best comparison I can make is of proud parents wanting to show off the talent of their children. We were immensely proud of the skills the children had learnt and it was a pleasure to see and hear them perform.
- Whilst I did not participate in the washing of the children's hair as I was collecting on a Saturday I do recall Jeyes Fluid in the home. I recall SND 311 I think he was called, who would have used it for cleaning toilets and drains. You always knew he had been using it because the smell was very distinctive.
