



6. You got fed in the home but I remember I hated the lumpy porridge. The nur tried to force me to eat it a few times but they eventually eased off because think they got the message that I wasn't going to eat it. I would rather take slapping than eat it. She would have disciplined us by using her knuckle with her fist closed. It would have been a crack on the back or side of the head or whatever side she came at you. She could have hit you ever morning for a week or over a period of days. The beatings mostly occurred from	a to es
7. She would also hit us for being in the wrong place at the wrong time. I was kept along with HIA 86 hen I went in to the home but I remember when I was about	ee w er. /e

she would not have hit you. SR 6 buld have hit you with anything that came to hand and I got hit several times by her, I got hit with brush shafts and with a dustpan brush as well. SR 6 ft the home in/around and I do not know where she went but the beatings eased after her departure.

- 8. The nuns had an old school house where they used to take us on holiday in Shrove in Donegal. All the boys were in one room with mattresses on the ground. HIA 86 and I were small and we had one mattress and our own sleeping bags but had a problem with bed wetting. I remember we received two main whippings from SR 6 bedwetting. We had wet the bed and although we were trying to hide it SR 6 aught on she whipped us with the top of a fishing rod. She grabbed the springy bit at the top of the rod and walloped us with it. It left marks on my legs, it was the first time I ever saw white and red marks along the back of our legs where we had been hit.
- 9. The other occasion I recall where we got a whipping was when we were playing down in our playground at Termonbacca in an area that we called the forest. We were playing a game of soldiers and broke a branch off the tree but we thought nothing of it. We later saw SR 6 ming with the branch and she was pointing in the window at us. She beat both of us hard with this branch once she had stripped it of leaves and then we were sent to our room. He told me years later that he wanted to sit on the cold tiles rather than go up the stairs as the cold tiles were easing the pain he felt from the beating.
- 10. Every day after school I polished my shoes and did my homework then I got changed into my shorts and slippers and went down to the pitch to play football. That is what I was wearing when SR6 eve me the beating. I am sure other members of lay staff saw her do this but they had no control over that woman, she was a law unto herself. She was an evil, evil woman.






15. There was a lot of bullying by the older lads also but that made us tough. We took our beatings. We also used to get thrown into the big dryers and these were turned on and we were spun around. The older boys would have done that to you. This was always done out of earshot and away from the sight of any staff. It was easy for this bullying by the older boys to take place without the staff noticing. There were never very many staff on duty, only two were on at any one time and there were over two dozen boys. I recall one boy called SND 35 hd we used to call him SND 35 hd he was bullied severely by the older boys.

17. Over the years my mother visited me and my brother and sister. She might have been sometimes and they wouldn't allow her to see us but we would have always tried to see her. She did her best. I hold no grudge whatsoever against my parents. I do however hold a grudge against the care system because at the end of the day we should have been looked after, cared for and protected but we suffered and especially during the first two years in Termonbacca.

Other boys on a bank up ahead were throwing stones down at us so I lifted one stone out and threw it up at them but it ricocheted off a wire fence and hit a young boy on the head and he started crying. and they sent me to St Pat's in Belfast. I remember having to attend at Woodburn Barracks in Belfast for questioning about this incident. I was just defending myself but at St Patrick's Training College. 27.I was then brought back to Fort James again and at this stage I was totally uncontrollable. The Fort James staff did not like me as I would not appease them or adhere to what they wanted. They could not handle me and I loved it but then they made me return to Fort James. 
Fort James had put me into one of their training flats where they try

The at Fort James, a guy called FJ 33 was going to take me there so I said I was going to get my coat and that is when I ran away. I ran to my mother's and I knew they would come looking for me right away. Later that night I heard a knock on the door of my mother's house and I saw FJ 33 standing at the door so I never answered it. After that I had to appear in court and the judge said I could live with my mother. I was never put under a training school order.

They asked and I if we knew anything about that particular allegation but I never heard anything further from them.

35. The police also questioned me as to whether or not I had ever been abused by SND 33 of the home, but he never abused me. I

36.I have no complaints about any institution other than Termonbacca. Neither my mother nor my father ever lifted a hand to me and I was put in to Termonbacca where I took beatings and then was abused when I was supposed to be protected. Those first few years at Termonbacca were the worst and had a negative impact on my life thereafter. Also, I was in and that should not have been allowed to happen. I had potential as a student but I was never given time to settle anywhere and that had a very dramatic impact not only on my life within these institutions but my life post care.

Events Leading to Admission:

Although HIA 92 has been with the SND 226 family for problems as such did not arise until the Summer of this year. In particular HIA 92 has indulged in frequent bouts of stealing from the SND 226 home and there is evidence to suggest that he has been stealing outside of the home as well. This has brought him into conflict with foster parents and the other children within the home.

Unfortunately, despite being given every possible opportunity to discuss any problems or pressures which he may have been under, HIA 92 has remained extremely uncommunicative. HIA 92 failure to explain his behaviour and to discuss any difficulties he may have been experiencing have resulted in the foster parents becoming frustrated and at a loss to know how to work with him.

On HIA 92 left the SND 226/238 home around 5 p.m. giving no indication whatever to his foster parents of anything being amiss. He was requested by SND 226/238 to be home at 7.30 p.m. and certainly no later than 8 p.m. HIA 92 arrived at Nazareth House, Bishop Street shortly after 5 p.m. He remained there until around 7.30 p.m. during which time he gave no indication of anything being wrong. When advised by SR 17 that it was time to be going home HIA 92 stated that he did not wish to return to his foster parents. The Standby Social Worker was subsequently contacted.

At this meeting we hoped by discussion to decide what we mentioned doing during HIA 92 period of assessment.

SND 467 gave an update on the reasons for to bring about the Foster placement breakdown. SND 467 felt unclear as to whether or not there was any possibility of HIA 92 returning to the care of Mr and the light of this it was felt that a meeting should be organised with the family as soon as possible to give some indication of the direction we should intend going.

HH 11 spoke of how HIA 92 had settled into the unit and her contact with him to date. HIA 92 has a strong bond with staff and children from Nazareth Mouse and is quite adament that he wants to return there - although is not against being fostered again. He sees the placement with the SND 226 family as being over and has spoken very negatively about his foster father. Already has shown himself to be quite capable of playing one person off against another. It is felt that he has done this quite successfully in the situations he set up between his foster parents and Nazareth House.

Contact has also been made with the school regarding how HIA 92 has been during this period of unrest. They found him to be very unhappy and continually asking for tablets for various pains. He has not caused any management problems within the school but is definitely underachieving in his school work.

Since HIA 92 admission staff and children from Nazareth House have been in regular contact, with someone visiting almost every day. It was felt that this contact should be decreased to give us more opportunity to get to know HIA 92 SND 467 agreed to pass this request on to the staff from Nazareth House. He also agreed to meet with SND 239 to set up weekly visits - Sundays being the day suggested.

It was agreed that we would hold the meeting with Mr and SND 238 as soon as possible and in the light of this discussion -, proceed from there - Either to re-establish links with the foster family or work with HIA 92 to find a placement best suited to his needs.

	I enclose for your information, a number of reports which I have received in respect of the above named boy. Two of the reports dated and refer to occasions when staff were aware that he had been drinking. This issue was focussed on by both the boy's primary worker and Social Worker.
	On HIA 92 returned from a visit to his mother which obviously distressed him. He had attention was necessary.
	On HIA 92 was returned to the Unit in a very drunken state. He became extremely aggressive and threatening, from under his mattress attempting to injure himself. The Sisters had to restrain him. An ambulance was summoned and HIA 92 was taken to the Accident and Emergency Unit at Altnagelvin Hospital. Because of his aggression there, no medical attention was given. HIA 92 was returned to the Unit and slept off the effects of the drink.
	On HIA 92 absconded from the Unit with another resident and returned at 2.00 a.m.
6	A review was held on It was noted then that when staff were following up the incident of about frequent sexual interference by a named year old, HIA 69 then he was resident in Termonbacca, approximately years ago. As a result of this information, it was agreed that would refer the matter to the R.U.C.
	There were serious concerns about HIA 92 incidents of drinking which seemed to become a problem after his father spent a couple of weeks in Derry early in As stated, this issue is being dealt with by the relevant workers. Nazareth House, however, expressed serious concerns about their ability to accommodate HIA 92 during these outbursts. It was agreed to seek a place for him in Fort James. As this may take a period of time, future incidents of disruptive behaviour would result in HIA 92 transfer to St. Patrick's Training School on a Place of Safety Order.



I refer to HIA 92's allegations against HIA 69 about incidents which allegedly occurred when both boys were resident in Termonbacca Children's Home. The mateur was passed to R.U.C. Strand Road, for investigation.

Detective Constable Stanley Smyth, C.I.D. has subsequently contacted this office and informed me that he has now received information from the D.P.P. office to the effect that no further action is to be taken regarding the case. Apparently the D.P.P. feel that there is insufficient evidence to warrant pursuing the matter further and the case is to be dropped.

HIA 92 had been in the flat downstairs and he came up in good form. I was in the living room and came in and said "Will I go on to bed now?" I said you might as well." HIA 92 said, "Is FJ 13 not soint to her bed?" I said "That's not your business! He went into FJ 13 room very aggressively and pointed his tinger at her and said, "you get into your bed." I told him I did not want any bullying. He hit me a slap on the face and oulled me around and then slapped me on the other side of the face. I pushed him off and he stumbled ever a bed and then he kicked me. He got up and still pushed me about and cut on to the corridor. He sat down on a chair there. I said to him, "Don't you ever lift your hand to me again," and he still continued to swing his arps at me so I slapped him once on the face to restrain him. He then ran out and said he was going to his mother's flat. I told SR 19 who was in the other end of the flat in another bedroom. She got the car and followed him down and met his mother bringing him back."

Neither HIA 92 nor his mother made any complaint here regarding this incident. It has been reported in the Day Book and in the Incident.

I would seriously question the authenticity of both FJ 13 and HIA 92 version. HIA 92 is known to bully the other children and FJ 13 would be afraid to say anything that might have repercussions afterwards from HIA 92 FJ 28 seems to have been under severe provocation from HIA 92

I would like to point out that this was a one-off incident. We do not use corporal punishment here. FJ 28 was helping in a voluntary capacity at the time and since then she is no way involved in working with the children.
