

Personal Details



Nazareth House Overview

The principle aims of Nazareth House were:-

"To provide a loving, caring and stable environment in which the physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of the child are met"

"To assess each child's needs and to decide how best to help the child through an individual care plan."

"To ensure that opportunities are provided, within the home and outside it, through relationships with staff and other children, through contact with parents, social workers and friends, for the child to realise his full potential and gain a measure of independence – thus ensuring an early return to the community."

In broad terms and within the limitations imposed by the building, Nazareth House operated very much like a large family home. Although the actual building was large and had been built at the start of the century, the children's units were self-contained and designed and furnished to be homely, attractive and comfortable.

Unit 1 was located on the first floor of the building and Unit 2 was located immediately above this on the second floor, connected by a flight of stairs. Each unit generally operated independently of the other although both were overseen by the Officer –in-Charge, who was a nun. A nun was in charge of each unit and they also slept in this unit every night and had their own bedroom at the end of the hallway.

The unit consisted of a straight, main central hallway, approx. 15 metres in length, 3 metres wide, on which all main rooms were located (see diagram).

Eight to ten children, male and female, were normally resident within the unit, with an age range from 5 years to 17 years. The majority of children were resident on a medium to long-term basis and this enabled the establishment and development of good relationships between children and staff and helped provide a stable and homely environment.

Within the group living environment it was necessary to ensure a broad daily structure and routine that functioned in a predictable way for the children, e.g. bedtimes, mealtimes, homework times etc. and the staff team worked to ensure this continuity regardless of the individuals on duty, (this type of structure was often lacking in the children's family home).

Within this secure structure the residential social workers then dealt with the assessed and identified individual needs of each child through a personal care plan.

Daily Life within the unit was generally relaxed but busy with up to ten children of different ages and up to five members of staff interacting and activity was constantly taking place. At any given time from 3pm onwards there was always staff and children around the living room, hallway, dining room and office area.

Child Protection, Safeguards and Inspections

Upon admission every child was appointed a 'keyworker' (residential social worker). This ensured that every child could identify a specific person responsible for his or her care, although all residential staff were responsible for the care of the children.

Every child also had an appointed field social worker from the relevant community social work office. The field social worker visited the child at least once per month

Every child was issued with his or her own personal copy of a Nazareth House booklet explaining about life in residential care. A copy of this booklet was also given to the child's parents.

The booklet covered in a simple, yet comprehensive, manner all issues relating to life in a residential care home and explained the child's rights and responsibilities. This booklet explained to the child how to raise any concerns or worries that they

may have had. The booklet also contained a pre-paid envelope and 'contact card' addressed to the General Manager of Foyle Health & Social Services. Children did not have to detail the nature of their complaint but only had to put their name on the card before posting. A post box was located in Bishop Street close to the home.

An Inspector from The Social Services Inspectorate carried out an annual 3 day inspection of the home. This was a thorough examination of every aspect of the operation of the home and the care provided to the residents. The inspector was present in the unit during different times of the day from early morning to evening.

The inspector also sent a confidential questionnaire (prior to his visit) to every child resident within the unit and this was also sent to all residents who had previously been discharged from the unit. This questionnaire was also sent to the parents of current and past residents.

During the inspection the inspector made himself (herself) available for any child or staff member to speak privately with him. The inspector also spoke privately with a certain number of residents and staff, regardless if they had requested a meeting. He also joined the group during meal times, group meetings, homework time etc.

An individual recording book was kept for each child in the unit and staff on duty recorded in each book on a twice daily basis, morning and evening. All significant aspects of the child's day were recorded. In addition to this a unit log book recoded, on a daily basis, all significant events of the group as a whole. Every child had the facility to view the recordings made by staff in their individual book.

At 2pm every day staff due to finish their shift held a 'hand-over' meeting with staff coming on duty and shared any relevant information and issues and planned the day ahead.

A 'medicine book' was maintained for recording all prescribed medications and the administration of the same.

An 'untoward incident' book recorded any serious incidents such as a child's unauthorised absence, assaults etc. and a copy of all incident reports were sent to the relevant social services office.

A comprehensive case file was kept for each child and this pertained to a personalised care plan for the child. This was maintained, updated and inspected regularly.

Every six months a case review was held for every child. This was chaired by an assistant principle social worker from the relevant community social work office, and was attended by the child's field social worker, residential social worker and team leader. The child's teacher either attended or submitted a school progress report as did any other relevant professionals involved with the child. The child was encouraged to make his own contribution in writing (age appropriate) and was invited into the case review at some point. The child's parents were also invited to attend and also encouraged to submit their own written report.

The Nazareth House also had a voluntary advisory committee and a member of this voluntary committee also visited the unit on a regular unannounced basis for an informal visit / inspection.

Various visitors came to the unit on a daily basis at various times. These included parents and relatives, school friends, field social workers, education tutors, trades men etc.

Typical Daily Staff Duties

On a morning shift (8am to 4pm) 2 members of staff and a nun were on duty to get the children organised for school.

The afternoon shift (2-10pm) had 3 or 4 staff members plus a nun on duty. Since 1989 one staff member was on duty from 3pm to 11pm and then slept overnight in the unit (staff office). This meant that an adult slept at each end of the hallway.

Staff duties in the morning included getting children up in the morning, serving breakfast, ensuring they were properly ready (washed, teeth brushed, correct books, dinner money etc.) and then transporting children to school as required.

Afternoon duties included collecting children from school as required, preparing after-school snacks, helping with homework, taking children to activities or appointments as required. Organising and participating in or supervising outdoor activities in the playgrounds. Assisting at dinner time. Time was allocated throughout the week to ensure keyworkers had individual time to spend with his or her child.

RESPONSE TO HIA 127 STATEMENT TO THE INQUIRY

I have read the statements made by HIA 127 to The Inquiry dated 24th July 2013 and I vehemently deny all allegations made against me in this statement.

BRIEF BACKGROUND INFORMATION

I worked in Nazareth House when HIA 127 was resident there. Was a child who presented with many challenging behavioural problems. I was appointed as a 'Keyworker' to HIA 127 and had some success in helping HIA 127 to modify many of his extreme behaviours.

Then reference below to paragraph numbers relates to the paragraph numbers in the witness's statement to the Inquiry.

Paragraph 10

HIA 127 states that there were 'ten to fifteen' residents in Unit 2 of Nazareth House. This is incorrect; there was a maximum of ten residents in Unit 2.

HIA 127 names only four people as employed in Unit 2 as social work staff. This is incorrect as Nazareth House employed a much greater number of social work staff in Unit 2.

Paragraph 12

HIA 127 states that he was punished in the home every day. This is untrue and I deny it. HIA 127 like other residents, would occasionally have received a 'sanction' for misbehaviour which ranged from doing a minor chore to missing out on an activity. All such sanctions were recorded in the child's individual book and also recorded in the unit 'sanction book' which was regularly inspected.

HIA 127 states that his dinner was taken away if he did not finish it on time. This is untrue and I deny it. No child ever had a meal taken away before they had finished it

HIA 127 states that he was made to do the work of employees. This is untrue and I deny it. A clearly displayed, written kitchen rota ensured that no child was given more than one or two chores per week. Chores related to helping tidy up after the evening meal only, and a member of staff always assisted.

Paragraph 13

HIA 127 states that he developed when he was nine years old. I believe this is incorrect. My recollection is that HIA 127 developed around the age of thirteen. It is not true that his doctor advised against taking baths.

HIA 127 states that staff forcefully stripped him naked and put into a freezing cold bath or shower every night of the week. This is untrue and I deny it.

HIA 127 was resident in Nazareth house for years and using his own reckoning, of the frequency and duration, this mistreatment would have occurred more than one thousand times. The bathroom was located close to the centre of the main hallway and such behaviour would have been heard and witnessed by every resident and member of staff in the unit during this year period.

HIA 127 was years of age when I began work at Nazareth House and at that

years of age when I began work at Nazareth House and at that that age he would not have required any assistance with bathing or showering from any member of staff. He would have required frequent reminders and encouragement to maintain an acceptable level of personal hygiene but this was never attempted by using physically force as he alleges.

Paragraph 14

HIA 127 states that when he was years old he had an operation on his and a nurse examined his wound in the TV room (living room) in front of staff and with about fifteen other residents watching.

HIA 127 was years old when I started work in Nazareth House in June so I could not have been present. HIA 127 did not have an operation at any time when I worked in Nazareth House.

HIA 127 stated that up to fifteen residents were present, however the maximum number of residents in Unit 2 was ten.

From my many years employed in Nazareth House, together with my knowledge and experience of all systems, policies and procedures, I am confident that if a medical examination was required it would have taken place in the privacy of the child's bedroom or the visitors room. If HIA 127 was in pain and could not move from the living room, then the other residents would have been asked to leave and the door shut until the nurse had finished.

Paragraph 15

HIA 127 states that I turned his life into a nightmare, this is untrue and I deny it. I was HIA 127 keyworker and we had a good relationship. As part of my role as keyworker I would have occasionally taken HIA 127 out of the unit, usually for a walk into town or to a snooker hall etc. This was done with the full knowledge and approval of management of the home and all such trips were recorded. I did not buy HIA 127 computer games but I would have sometimes taken him to a café for a burger and soft drink as a treat.

Paragraph 16

HIA 127 states that I abused him for years. This is untrue and I deny it. I never ever abused HIA 127

HIA 127 states that I took him out whenever I wanted. This is untrue and I deny it. No staff could leave the unit with a child that he or she was keyworker to unless this period of time was first allocated and scheduled to fit around the other unit duties and activities. Time had to be arranged to accommodate all keyworkers to have individual time with the child.

At a social services case review in I was asked by the review panel if I would be willing to work with HIA 127 in the structured capacity of a 'befriender' as no foster parents could be found for HIA 127 I agreed that I would do so and HIA 127 was very happy with this arrangement.

The recorded minutes of this case review would be readily available.

This role of 'befriender' involved taking HIA 127 out of the residential unit, on my own time (approx. once a week) and this mainly entailed taking HIA 127 to my family home with the intention of introducing him to a normal family environment or joining him on an activity. HIA 127 thrived during this period and within a year he was successfully introduced to a foster family and within a few months he went to live with them. My role of 'befriender' to HIA 127 is fully documented and every date that he was with me was properly recorded and HIA 127 progress was regularly reviewed. No concerns were ever raised by HIA 127 or anyone else during this period.

Paragraph 17

alleges that I first sexually assaulted him on a single bed, in a mobile home in during the summer of the summer and I deny it.

Other children and staff shared the mobile home and because of the compact size it would have been immediately noticeable if a child and a staff member went into a small bedroom together.

HIA 127 states that he ran out of the mobile home and hid away for two hours, returning at 9pm.

If a child had gone missing, from the mobile home, on a holiday, his absence would have been quickly noticed and staff would have carried a search of the caravan park. An unsuccessful search would have resulted in the police being notified, especially when this happened away from home in unfamiliar surroundings. An untoward incident report would have been recorded and the details of absence would also be recorded in the unit books that were brought on holiday.

All members of staff at stated that HIA 127 did not go missing during the holiday. No recordings from the holiday support HIA 127 claim that he ran away as this is also untrue and I deny it.

Paragraph 18

HIA 127 states that I sexually abused him in his bedroom at Nazareth House, two months after the holiday in This is untrue and I deny it.

Following his holiday in HIA 127 was discharged from Nazareth House and he went to live with foster parents on this in paragraph 27 of his statement. Since HIA 127 was not resident in Nazareth House in twould have been impossible for him to be abused in Nazareth House at that time.

Paragraph 19

HIA 127 alleges that during the same week in of that I abused him the bathroom in Nazareth House whilst applying cream to his body.

This is untrue and I deny it.

As has been previously established HIA 127 was no longer resident in Nazareth House at this date and the incident could not have happened.

Even when HIA 127 had been resident in the unit, because of his age, he was responsible for applying his own cream, which he kept in his bedroom. If necessary he would have been reminded and encouraged to do so but on no occasion did I ever apply the cream to him.

The bathroom in Nazareth House had a lock on the door and I never ever entered the bathroom when HIA 127 was undressed.

Paragraph 20

HIA 127 states that during the bedroom in Nazareth House to the bathroom, stripped him naked and threw him

into a bath of cold water HIA 127 claims he then punched me on the head, got dressed and that I then threw him back into the bath with his clothes on. He alleges that I then left the bathroom after he soaked me but that I returned again, sexually assaulted him before holding both his wrists with just one of my hands, whilst he struggled.


This is untrue and I deny it. As has been previously established HIA 127 was no longer resident in Nazareth House at this date and the incident could not have happened.

At no time in Nazareth House was HIA 127 or any resident, ever thrown into a bath by me or any other member of staff.

If HIA 127 had been dragged from his bedroom, at the end of the hallway, to the bathroom, half way up the hallway, at 9pm at night, this would have been witnessed by many other residents and staff.

HIA 127 loes not explain why he would not have locked the bathroom door after I had left as this would have prevented me from returning. HIA 127 does not explain, why after he first got out of the bath he got dressed back into his clothes again and not into his bed clothes, which he indicates were in the bathroom. If these incidents had happened in the bathroom, over the period of time indicated by HIA 127 in the manner alleged by HIA 127 and that I had water thrown over me, this would have been noticed by other residents and staff.

Paragraph 21



This is untrue and I deny it. As has been previously established HIA 127 was no longer resident in Nazareth House at this date and the incident could not have happened.

If when HIA 127 states then the means then the school would not have been opened.

HIA 127 was in my then girlfriend's house (now my wife) on three short occasions. HIA 127 knew my girlfriend as she was also a social worker in and they had a good relationship. On the first occasion HIA 127 helped me to cut the grass and my girlfriend was present. On a second occasion HIA 127 was with me when I stopped by briefly to collect some books, my girlfriend was not present. On the third occasion HIA 127 was with me and helped put tiles, which I had previously removed from the bathroom walls, into bags for dumping. My girlfriend was present and HIA 127 carved on the plaster of the wall, SND 38 loves SND 39.

Paragraph 22 states that I sexually assaulted him on an overnight stay at my family home on This is untrue and I deny it. HIA 127 has alleged he was first abused in eight months before the date that he alleges that he was first abused. HIA 127 received permission to have an overnight stay at my family home on At this time I had been a 'befriender' to months and he had regular visits to my home during this period. HIA 127 had requested the overnight stay for Christmas and this was approved through his field social worker and the social work office. A record granting permission for this overnight stay would be readily available. This was the only occasion stayed overnight at my home. HIA 127 states that he slept in a top bunk and I slept on the bottom bunk. This is untrue and I deny it. I slept in a different room from HIA 127 Paragraph 23 HIA 127 states that on two or three occasions I tried to have anal sex with him in his bedroom in Nazareth House but he said no. HIA 127 alleges that he was first abused so this would have had to occur after this date when he was no longer resident in Nazareth House. This is untrue and I deny it. Paragraph 24 HIA 127 states that in I took him to my girlfriend's house and sexually abused him before taking him back to Nazareth House. This is untrue and I deny it. HIA 127 was in foster care so I would not have brought him to Nazareth House had I taken him to my girlfriend's house. At paragraph 21 I have previously explained the occasions and circumstances that HIA 127 was at my girlfriend's home.

Paragraph 25

HIA 127 states that in Nazareth House he was half starved and was hungry for most of the time because he was only allowed five minutes to eat his meals.

This is untrue and I deny it.

The dining room in Nazareth House consisted of three dining tables each with four chairs. These tables were close together (see diagram) and all children and staff ate together in the same dining room and meal times were relaxed and there was always more than enough food for everyone to have second helpings if requested.

Evening meals were cooked fresh in a central kitchen, which also provided meals to the home for the elderly, and brought to the unit in a heated trolley. Dinner was served around 5.30 pm and usually lasted about half an hour. Meals were served by staff and food was never removed from any child before he or she finished eating nor were meal times ever rushed.

During my years in Nazareth House HIA 127 never complained to me about meals being removed from him nor did he ever complain of being hungry. If HIA 127 had his meals removed after five minutes, on a daily basis, this would have had to be witnessed by all residents and all staff members.

A selection of fruit was readily and easily available throughout the day from fruit bowls and the kitchenette in the dining room had a fridge which was easily accessible to residents.

In my capacity as HIA 127 keyworker I was in regular contact with his form teacher, SND 42 and she was aware of HIA 127 circumstances and took a special interest in him. Never did SND 42 ever raise any concerns to me regarding HIA 127 being hungry at school, which I am confident that she would have done had she been aware of this.

Paragraph 26

I never witnessed HIA 127 being beaten by any adult in Nazareth House nor did ever tell me that he was ever hit or beaten. From my knowledge of WIA 127 I believe he would have made it immediately known if anyone had done so.

I believe this allegation is untrue.


Paragraph 27

HIA 127 states that he was abused by me in his foster home after he left Nazareth

This is untrue and I deny it.

I visited HIA 127 foster parent's at their home prior to his placement there as part of the introduction and phasing in process. HIA 127 foster parents had children of their own but this was their first time to foster a child. During the months following his placement I also visited the foster parents and HIA 127 at their home as part of a support system for HIA 127 and the foster parents.

At no time was I ever alone with HIA 127 in his foster home and his foster parents were always present when I visited. HIA 127 offers no explanation as to how this alleged abuse could have taken place in the foster home without the knowledge of his foster family.



Paragraph 8

HIA 233 states that she was made to walk to school whilst I drove other children who were 'the nuns favourites'.

This is untrue and I deny it. When I drove the minibus I took all children that required transport and no child was every excluded for any reason.

Paragraph 9

HIA 233 states that worked in Unit 1. This is incorrect.

Paragraph 10

HIA 233 states she shared a bedroom with eight other girls. This is untrue.

Before children had their own private bedroom (from 1990) residents shared larger bedrooms. Two or three residents shared a large bedroom but never was a bedroom occupied by nine residents as stated by HIA 233

Paragraph 11

HIA 233 states that she was force fed by staff, including myself, at meals times and was also forced to eat her vomit.

This is untrue and I deny it.

As I have previously stated all children ate together, in the dining room, at the same time. I never force fed hor and it is anyone else to do so. I was present at meal times for many years and never ever did I witness her being force fed by anyone. All A 233 was never made to sit all day at the dining table neither was the same food repeatedly served to hill A 233 All uneaten food was put in a bin and disposed of immediately after the meal was finished.

HIA 233 states that this was witnessed by everyone in the dining room and I believe this would have been the case had it in fact ever happened.

Paragraph 12

HIA 233 states that she had an appendix operation and that I accompanied her to hospital. This is true but HIA 233 never ever told me that she was left to lie overnight on the bathroom floor. I believe this is untrue.

At the hospital I stayed with HIA 233 in the ward until she was ready to go to the theatre. I recall that from arriving in the ward HIA 233 held my hand and did not let go, to such an extent that I had to accompany HIA 233 holding her hand, as her bed was pushed by a porter, from the ward to the door of the operation theatre, where only then was she persuaded to let go.

HIA 233 often reminisced about this many years after the event and she found it very funny.

Paragraph 15

ti. I worked with many different members of staff, over many years, and I found everyone, without exception, to be exceptionally caring and committed to the children that they cared for.

HIA 233_{states} that I threw HIA 127_{and} SND 283 into freezing cold baths and showers.

This is untrue and I deny it. I refer to my response to paragraph 13 of statement.

Paragraph 16

HIA 233 states that I and another member of staff threw her and another girl into a room to beat each other up.

This is untrue and I deny it. I never encouraged any children to fight nor did any other member of staff.

SND 331 as a 'spastic' and 'retard' and that the child was hidden away from visitors.

This is untrue and I deny it.

There was a young child resident in the unit called This child, because of her young age, was very popular with everyone in the unit.

parents visited the unit frequently.

No child was ever referred to in such derogatory terms by staff nor was any child ever hidden away when visitors called to the unit.

SIGNATURE OF WITNESS

I am known as SR 142 and I was formerly known as SR 142 when I worked in Nazareth House, Derry from been made aware by Detective Inspector Crawford of the allegations made by a former resident of Nazareth House, HIA 127 against a lay employee SND 38 I have been made aware of allegations regarding a holiday in and I would state that during those holidays I would find it difficult to believe that two people could have ever found themselves alone due to the number of people about and that during that time I can never HIA 127 ever wanting to lie down during the day or ever running away. No allegations were ever made to me and I would find it difficult to believe that such goings on could have happened in the circumstances I have mentioned. Detective Inspector Crawford has asked me regarding the bathing practices and I would say that it was normal for older children to bathe themselves however HIA 127 had a medical problem which required applying cream. SND 38 would have been present during these times to supervise the application of such cream. Detective Inspector Crawford has also asked me about the practice at

children leaving the premises in the company of their SND_{orke}5and 4 visiting the private homes of their key worker. The reason behind this is that a number of children had no suitable family they could go to and that they joined in the family of their worker in order to try and give them as

talked through the different allegations and the discrepancies in HIA 127 statements to police.
P. Holiday Uncertain of the dates as he did not have the records with him of did not have access to N.H. records since he was suspended. SND 38 pointed out the discrepancies here. In the first statement had gone to bed in the afternoon. In the second statement it was evening, discrepancies in the description of chalet and position during the abuse.
There was no record of running away or missing claims that if was missing staff would have been aware of this.
Regarding this incident at P. The following year had an option of going of holidays to P. knowing that would be on duty there or going with foster parents. Holidays to go to P. SND 38 posed the question "would have made this decision if he had been abused the previous year at P?"
stated that one of the allegations claimed that dragged along the corridor to bathroom with screaming. He was alleged to have undressed put him into cold bath, lifted him out, abused him, got him dressed and put him back in the bath with all his clothes on, while all the time was punching and screaming. Staff and residents would have heard the screams because the accommodation was a flawithin the N.H. It was compact with bedrooms, bathrooms and living rooms close together.
NOTE: That mother alleged that girlfriend put her daughter in a cold bath.
At this stage I brought attention around to the policy and procedures which governed residents' visits to the homes of staff.
confirmed that it was customary practice at that time for different members of staff to tak children to their homes, particularly if they did not have contact with their own parents or relatives. This practice seemingly went on until the allegations were made against SND 38
was told by the police that at the initial stages of the investigation that Social Service representatives denied that they knew that was going out with He claimed this was not the case, Social Services personnel approved of these visits, they were recorded and he could not take out child without the approval of his supervisor at N.H., or unknown to Social Services. All visits were well documented.
I asked what were the procedures regarding his visits to in the foster home. 

Part of my work entails the inspection of statutory and voluntary children's homes. In this regard I was involved in the inspection of Nazareth House Children's Home, Bishop Street, Londonderry on the following dates:



Each inspection involved spending 2 to 3 days in the home making observations, checking statutory records, speaking to management, staff and children and occasionally attending meetings. The aim was to assess the suitability of the environment, the quality of care provided for the children, the management structure and monitoring arrangements, staffing and the standard of professional practice within the home. Following each inspection a report was prepared and issued to the Sisters of Nazareth who

are the administering authority for the home. Where the reports carried recommendations there was an expectation that these would be implemented. In the course of an inspection it was my practices to examine the records which are required to be kept under the provisions of Regulation 5(3) of the Children and Young Persons (Voluntary Homes) Regulations (NI) 1975. Theses are: The admissions/discharges register; the record of events of importance connected with the home; the record of fire practice drills and all fire precautions agreed with the Fire Authority; and menus of the meals provided. In addition it would have been my practice to read some of the children's case files and any other records kept by the home's staff. However, it was the practice to select about 20% of the files and to scan them selectively as I would not have had the time to read them all in full. The children living in Nazareth House were advised in advance that an inspection was to take place. It was my practice to speak to them informally when I was in the home, to eat with them or to take part in an activity e.g. playing snooker or pool. It was also my practice to advise the children that I was available to see any of them individually if they so wished. I have no recollection of speaking to HIA 127 asking to meet me. Normally I would also speak to the staff of the home. This was confined to those who were on duty while I was undertaking the inspection. Depending on the time available I may have seen some of them individually, spoken to a group of staff or attended a unit staff meeting. It was customary for each staff to act as keyworkers for one or more children. This entailed taking a special interest in their health, education and general welfare. My experience was that each child would have a care plan which was agreed with Social Services and that some of the identified tasks would have been carried out by the keyworker e.g. taking a child to the dentist, helping with school homeworks, shopping for clothes, etc. Keyworkers were also expected to spend some time undertaking individual work with children e.g. counselling them about personal or SIGNATURE OF

own children. There were some initial difficulties - HIA 127 teluctance to come home in time, his tendancy to give cheeky answers when challenged, and to lie. However, these difficulties have been confronted by SND 45 and SND 46 and have lessened considerably. SND 475 notes that HIA 127 has become noticeably more relaxed and confident in recent weeks, and less defensive. The other major problem came when the SND 45, SND 46 his covered that he had been making telephone calls on one of the 'sex lines' which are commonly advertised. When challenged he immediately admitted that he had made the calls. His admission had been very encouraging to both foster-parents. Arrangements have been made for the SND 45, SND 46 to be compensated for the costs.

The review discussed HIA 127 background, and his previous experience in fostercare, in some detail.

SND 46 is very keen that he should be able to maintain active contact with his brother and sister, and is prepared to facilitate this as much as possible. She expresses some concern, however, about contact with HIA 127 mother - because of her inconsistency in the past, and because of the real fear that her motive in contacting the foster-home directly would be destructive. Both these fears are substantiated by this department's experience of SND 362 Should she turn up, SND 46 should immediately contact the Social Services Department (including the emergency service). In principle, SND 362 hould arrange any access visits through negotiation with SND 475

The issue which is causing the greatest problem for present is the role of SND 38 HIA 127 houseparent from Nazareth House, incomplete the management of the placement. SND 38 whose relationship with HIA 127 is a positive and important one, is managing a behaviour modification programme, involving the use of a detailed, daily, file. Whilst the SND 45 SND 46 ommitment to HA 127 and to the placement, they feel that it is too intensive, that they were not fully consulted about setting it up, and that it represents something of an intrusion into the routines of their home. It was established in the course of the review that this form of support was not planned when should discuss the issue directly with SND 38 with a view to (a) appraising him of the way SND 45 and SND 46 re feeling (b) reducing the extent of his involvement.

Overall, this placement, though still in its very early stages, has settled well. SND 45 and SND 46 have been able to negotiate HIA 127 initial phase of testing them out, with tolerance and patience, and he is beginning to respond by gradually learning to adapt to them, and to the routines of their family. They are very pleased with the progress to date, and have been able to use the support of their Social Worker very effectively.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. There are no access arrangements for SND 362 to contact Social Services if she wishes to arrange to see her son. The foster-parents should contact Social Services immediately if she makes any attempt to contact HIA 127 lirectly.
- 2. Contact between HIA 127 and members of his family should be made as approriate, through consultation between HIA 127 the Social Worker and the foster-parents.
- 3. Social Worker to contact SND 38 lirectly, in order to resolve the problems arising from the intensity of her continued support to HIA 127



Due to the conclusions of this investigation, it was agreed that SND 38 would be re-instated. At this time due to my knowledge of the history of the HIA 127 family and in particular previous threats and allegations that had made towards Social Services, it was easy to conclude that could be behind her sons allegations:

went to visit his brother SND 97 in Prince's
Gardens Childrens Unit, Larne. On his return
complained that SND 97 had ruined his
visit. When asked for clarification
informed me that SND 38 "out of goodness" had
sent a gift with him for SND 97 When he gave it
to SND 97 became angry and abusive and got

This phone call was confirmed by staff who were
on duty at Prince's Gardens.

(ii) The above information SND 38 did not share with me, however at a later date I raised the issue with him and SND 38 casually dismissed it as SND 97 being SND 97. Despite me querying what triggered SND 97 anger, SND 38 persisted to be dismissive.

On 1st December 1997, SND 97 absconded from Prince's Gardens and eventually arrived at Nazareth House. During this time he made disclosures to myself. (See detailed report attached). C

With hindsight, when I consider the number of incidents that have come to light and SND 38 involvement, either in a management or investigative role or allegations against him, it would now give me great cause for concern if SND 38 was to return to work with children.

Fortunately I am not so naive and am well aware of what had already taken place behind the scenes during the previous months.


A short time after my second suspension, following the allegations by SND 384 and following the media hype about SR 2 came to her own conclusion that I in fact must be guilty of child abuse. It therefore followed that I must have abused residents of Nazareth House. A few weeks earlier SND 97 had returned a small gift which I had sent to him through his brother although there was a very simple explanation for this, SR 2 chose to ignore this in favour of her own theory i.e that I must have in fact abused SND 97 The reason I know this was because she was quite willing to share her theory with staff.

Prior to my suspension re: HIA 127 I had a good and trusting relationship with SND 97 He was a very troubled and confused child but when in the right frame of mind, was prepared to work closely with myself. He had alleged numerous accounts of sexual abuse against many different individuals, was a regular absconder, got involved in petty crime and inappropriate sexual conduct with peers. He had confided in me, despite his young age, that he believed he was 'gay' and feared that he had AID's, he also had a tendency to dress and portray himself as a girl. These problems and worries he shared with me, all of which are fully documented.

Knowing SND 97 as I do, I have no doubt that following my suspension and his subsequent awareness of the allegation of sexual abuse made against myself, he would have been very confused. I never had the opportunity to explain my departure to SND 97 and by the time I was reinstated, he had been moved to Shortly after returning to work I met as he was

the mess that I'm in if you had kept me, you could have made me do as I was told". SND 97 talked freely of his suicide attempts wanting to end his life and how frightened he became when he had attempted to do so and how he always went for help. After some discussion I asked SND 97 that in the future if he felt down or wanted to harm himself did he feel he could ring me. He responded he would. Eventually wher SND 97 settled and became more at ease, I reminded SND 97 that this was the first time I had seen him since he left on 21st October 1996 although I have spoken to him on a few occasions on the phone. I then went on to ask SND 97 if he could tell me why he got so upset and angry on the occasion when him on the 15th July and delivered a gift to him which SND 38 h (Acting Team Leader who is currently on precaution surveys suspension) had sent up. ND 38 said or done responded very angrily, "I hate him!" I questioned why, had something to him. His response was "I would not let him touch me", but SND 97 went on to say, "I know it happened to others". I asked how did he know, "Has somebody said something to you". He said, "I don't want to talk about it", at this point he was crying again. I then went on to say if you or another child is hurting because of something that was said or done I would like to know so that I could help or do something about it. SND 97 looked at me and said, "It was SND 99". I asked "Did tell-you something". He said, "No", quite angrily. "I saw him, I went into his office, he was sitting on his swivel chair, was standing in front of him. SND 99 trousers were opened and partly down. It was the office next to the visitor's room. SND 38 told me to wait outside for 5 minutes". SND 97 stated that, came out his face was red and he would not look at me". "When At this point SND 43 (RSW) re-entered the room and our conversation ended. I did not pressure SND 97 disclosure further as I felt it would not be appropriate due to joint protocol procedures. Having given SND 97 my reassurance to help I felt it was appropriate to pass this information to the relevant personnel. SND 470 states that SND 99 has made no 'direct' accusations 'to date' against myself, which gives the obvious inference that he may have made indirect accusations or is likely to do so in the future. Would it have been too difficult to have simply stated the truth of the matter i.e. SND 99 has made no accusations against SND 38 I am not however surprised by this little subtlety as it is clearly influenced by a letter from SR 2 (5-12-98), where she uses the exact same expression to infer the exact same thing.

SND 470 makes reference to SR 2 report of 8 December 1998, in which SR 2 summarises her reservations about me returning to work. These reservations listed are in fact an account of duties which I carried out in the past and done so in the highest professional manner, following all recognised and established procedures and thoroughly recorded and shared all aspects of my work with the appropriate people.

What SR 2 lists as reservations should in fact be a list of the high standards set by myself in my work. Never before were these roles of mine called into question and I challenge SR 2 to produce one shred of evidence to substantiate her suggestions that I deliberately impeded a police investigation by misusing my authority, as suggested, to assist alleged perpetrators.

I find these remarks by SR 2 highly offensive and libellous and yet indicative of my claims that SR 2 has engaged in a self appointed mission, aimed at proving her warped theory that

Unfortunately, SND 470 accepts, at face value, the misinformation given to her by SR 2 and also swallows the blatant lie that I refused a request to seize photographs from SND 99

I am a child abuser, regardless of what methods she has to use.

SND 470 comments briefly on a report included by SR 2 regarding an incident in which SND 99 shares a concern that he has about his penis. This is in turn shared with a member of staff

[9] who appeared on behalf of the plaintiff with placed great stead on certain memoranda and letters which were put before this court. It is necessary for me to outline them in some detail. On 7 April 1998, SR 2 of the employers wrote to the sub-divisional commander of the RUC Strand Road in Londonderry in the aftermath of a telephone conversation she had had with Detective Inspector CID, Strand Road in relation to the plaintiff. That letter recorded that the plaintiff was presently suspended from employment on full pay since 1997 due to the allegations of a sexual nature which were currently being investigated by the police. The letter concluded:

"As you can appreciate the difficulties of SND 38 returning to a child care setting, we are therefore anxious to clarify where things are at with your department so that we as employers can decide on appropriate action without compromising your investigation.

I would appreciate an early response and any information which you are in a position to share with us."

[20] There is appended to that memorandum, dated 23 September 1998, a written handwritten hand note from R White ACC to the head of C2 in the following terms:

"Approval is given for Detective Inspector McAuley Care N & L Divisions to release the necessary information to SND 38 employers. A written record of the details disclosed should be recorded on this file for future reference."

[21] The next recorded note or memorandum surfaces on an undated note in my papers (but which I was told was dated 20 October 1998) from EW Anderson A/ACC Crime to the solicitor acting on behalf of the Sisters of Nazareth purporting to reply to their letter of 7 April 2008 couched in the following terms, inter alia:

'I can confirm to you that an exhaustive investigation has been conducted by the Royal Ulster Constabulary and the Garda Siochana arising out of complaints against SND 38 and others.

Although the Director of Public Prosecutions, both here in Northern Ireland and in the Republic of Ireland have (on the basis of evidence available) directed no prosecution, I have to inform you that as a result of the above investigations the view of the RUC is that SND 38 is not a fit person to continue in employment as a social worker because of our paramount concern for the safety and welfare of children'."

- [22] Thereafter the plaintiff was dismissed on 30 March 1999 by his employer. Two disciplinary procedures were invoked by the employer. It was the plaintiff's case that his solicitor was given a bundle of papers and on 29 January 1999 informed that there was to be a panel meeting within the next day or two. His solicitor successfully submitted that extra time needed to be given and so the panel hearing was convened within two weeks. After the hearing he was informed on 30 March 1999 that he was dismissed.
- [23] The plaintiff then proceeded to take proceedings against his employer for unfair dismissal. On 10 December 2001 that claim was settled in a written agreement on the basis that his applications be dismissed. Terms of the written settlement included the following:
