Apart from the Mason Investigation File and D/Constable Cullen's enquiry, which were brought to the attention of the Director and the Assistant Director of the Eastern Health and Social Services Board, all other matters were dealt with at District level by Mr Clive Scoular, the District Social Services Officer.

583. All persons involved, including police, have made statements in relation to their actions at the time, and no evidence has been found to support any criminal charges regarding this aspect of the investigation.

CHARGES

- 584. Although there is strong pressure by the Northern Ireland Gay Rights Association and through the European Courts, to have the Law in Northern Ireland brought into line with that in the rest of the United Kingdom, it is still an offence for male persons of any age to commit homosexual acts.
- 585. It is considered that in view of the recommendations at paragraph 41 that all residents and former residents be granted immunity from prosecution in respect of offences committed by them with the defendants, Mains, Semple and McGrath, and that this should be extended to include offences committed with each other and other adult males not connected with Kincora.
- 586. The exception to this should be the indecent assault admitted by HIA 534/R4 on the eight year old boy, KIN 62

I have been in Welfare Care since I was four years of age. I never knew my own parents and was with foster parents until I was sixteen years of age. At that time I was taken from my foster parents and put into Kincora Boys Hostel, Upper Newtownards Road by the Welfare people. The staff at Kincora Hostel when I went there were Mr Mains who was in charge and Raymond Semple was second in charge. There was also another man there at the time on occasions. His name was Hugh Quinn. I am not sure whether he was on the staff or not but he stayed there on occasions and was very friendly with Mr Mains. I was in the Hostel less than a week, possibly the second night I was there I remember I was in my bedroom. There were some other boys in the room in their own beds and it was late. The other boys in the room fell asleep and I was still awake and the bedroom door opened and with the street light I saw that Hugh Quinn had come into the room. He stood at the door for a long time and I let on I was sleeping. He then came over to the bed and I felt him touch the blankets of my bed. I jumped up and got out of bed and switched on the room light. I asked Quinn what he was doing and he said just tucking you in. He left the room and I fell asleep. The next thing I knew was being awakened by feeling a hand on my leg underneath the bed clothes. The hand was just above my knee.

I saw that Hugh Quinn was standing beside my bed and I shouted at him. He left the room and closed the door. The next morning I told Mr Mains about what Hugh Quinn had done to me and Mr Mains told me he would look into it. There was no more trouble with Quinn for about a fortnight. I remember again I was sleeping in my bed, there were two other boys in their own beds in the same room. Again I was awakened by someone touching my hand. I saw Hugh Quinn standing at the side of my bed. He was wearing his pyjamas and I saw with the street light that he had his penis out through the opening in the front of his pyjamas. He was worked up and had an erection. He put my hand on his penis and I immediately jumped up and screamed. Hugh Quinn then left the room. I think I went to Mr Mains room at the time to tell him but he would not answer my knock on his bedroom door. Nothing happened for about three or four months because Quinn had been away for some time. I remember one night then, I was up in the study and I was reading a book. I was on my own. Hugh Quinn came into the study, he was fully clothed. He said to me something, lets have you. I knew what he meant, he wanted me to sexually interfere with him. I was scared and I ran out of the study. That was all that Quinn did to me, he never made any more advances to me. I remember on at least two occasions I told both Mr Mains and Mr Semple about the behaviour of Hugh Quinn towards me but they appeared dry and did not seem to care. I remember also that Mr Mains interfered with me. I was only in the Hostel about a month to six weeks when I had a pain in my groin. I told Mr Mains about this pain and he asked me to go to the bathroom to examine me. He told me to drop my trousers and underpants down to my ankles. Mr Mains felt around my groin and private parts. He did not appear to be interested in my trouble but I realize now what he was after. That was all that happened that night. I remember that probably about two to three months later Mr Mains told me to go up and have a bath. I went up and was having a bath when Mr Mains came in. He locked the bathroom door and he started to bath me. He was fully clothed. As he bathed me he rubbed

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around my private parts with his hands. I told him I was old enough to bath myself. - 22. Although the Prosecution's charges succeeded, it is interesting to consider the evidence in support of the charges. The complainants had made no official approach to the police or to any other authority about matters that had laid dormant for as long as twenty years. Complaints had only been made after the police had contacted potential victims and to some extent canvassed for complaints. Having learned of offences alleged to have taken place many years earlier the investigating officers interviewed MAINS and obtained confessions to a substantial number of offences and through this enterprising and determined approach eventually succeeded in bringing MAINS to justice for crimes that he appeared to have got away with more than a decade ago. It is appreciated that the evidence was bolstered by the number of witnesses available to prove systematic conduct by MAINS over more recent years which must surely have influenced MAINS to plead guilty to charges concerning offences committed so long ago.
- 23. In assessing this 1958-1964 phase of the Kincora scandal when SEMPLE and McGRATH had not yet come on the scene,

 I take the view that the Royal Ulster Constabulary officers were remarkably successful in pursuing what many would have considered to be a lost cause.

I was born in the Belfast City Hospital in 1947. Almost immediately I was placed in care at a Welfare Home in the hospital because of problems Belfast. I understand my mother was unable at my home at to cope because of my father's health. In 1956 I was transferred to the , Park Lodge Children's Home, Antrim Road, where I remained for a few months until my transfer to the Williamson House Home. Whilst at Park Lodge Joe Mains was one of the Housefathers. I was never assaulted by any persons during my stay at Park Lodge or Williamson House. However one night when I was in bed, late in the evening in the Williamson House Home, I woke up and saw Joe Mains standing at the side of another boy's bed. This was KIN 180 who slept in the bed next to mine. KIN 180 was kneeling on the bed when I saw Joe Mains kiss him on the lips. I glanced away and may have gone back to sleep. I would not be sure whether Joe Mains was working at Park Lodge or Kincora when this incident happened. Miss Ingram and Mrs McKaig were the officers in charge at Williamson House at that time. When I was transferred to Kincora on 8 September 1961 Joe Mains was the Officer in Charge and Raymond Semple was his assistant. I must have been at the home between 6 to 9 months when I recall having a conversation with Joe Mains in the kitchen of the hostel. I don't remember what the conversation was about but there certainly was nothing of a sexual nature referred to. Eventually Joe Mains went up to his bedroom which was on the left side of the second landing. I either went up first or followed Joe upstairs intending to go to my own bedroom which was on the same landing but on the opposite side of the landing and to the front of the house. As a result of the death of my mother when I was aged about 14 years I was taken into care. I was put into the Bawnmore Boys' Hostel and spent about 18 months to two years there. I was then transferred to the Kincora Boys' Hostel. I stayed about 10 months at that hostel until I got a living-in job at the Stormont Hotel. This job lasted a few months and I eventually returned to the Kincora Hostel and stayed there for about 10 months. On the both occasions I was at Kincora Joe Mains was in charge and was assisted by Raymond Semple. I have been told that there have been allegations of a homosexual nature involving the staff and boys. Nothing of that nature ever happened to me nor was I aware that this was going on with other boys. I can recall one boy who called back to the hostel. father and indicated that he could not talk to his mother easily. He agave evidence that, although he saw his older brother when he was home weekends, they had fallen out when R7 was about seventeen.

- 3.92 A further possible avenue of complaint lay through Mr and Mrs John Smyth who had looked after him at his previous residential home and whom he visited from time to time. Other possibilities included complaining to one of the Kincora ancillary staff with whom he was friendly or to his foster parents. R7's evidence in relation to all of these options wasthat he was afraid that any complaint would get back to Mr Mains. He discounted a complaint to the police at that time on the grounds that he would not have been believed. He told us that he did not recall reporting to a probation officer during his two years on probation from late 1966. While a complaint to his probation officer was no more likely than a complaint to another party, we felt sure that he must have been in regula contact during his probation period. We endeavoured to check on this but R7's probation file was no longer available. As for discussing the matter with other residents, R7 said that, notwithstanding that he had resisted the advances, he felt ashamed of what had happened and would not tell his friends about such things.
- 3.93 R7's evidence as to the reason for his being apprehensive about making a complaint to various parties was rather ambivalent. On the one hand he referred to the alleged physical beating as instilling in him a fear of Mr Mains and he said that he feared the consequences of a complaint being reported to Mr Mains. He also spoke of a fear of being put somewhere else, perhaps borstal. At a different point in his evidence, however, he said that he was not frightened of Mr Mains beating him. He also agreed that his resistance to Mr Mains' advances did not result in any retaliation or threat of retaliation. As for Mr Semple, R7 referred to him as a very kind-hearted person and did not regard the nature of his advances as very serious although he did not want them to continue.
- 3.94 R7's reluctance to make a direct complaint clearly limited the opportunities for detection, as did the fact that he was not regularly visited by a Social Welfare Officer. The significance of the latter, however, must be qualified to some degree on the grounds that a number of other possibilities were open to R7 and he chose not to take them up, for the reasons stated in his evidence. In fact, his attitude of resistance

and non co-operation appears to have prevented or discouraged Messrs Mains and Semple from attempting to develop a more active homosexual relationship with him. This may have made it less imperative for him to complain but in any case some of the options must have seemed unpromising. Complaint to the police or the probation service, for instance, could have been construed as an attempt to divert attention from his own difficulties with the law. It may also have been the case that his perception of his family's problems, and of its standing with the Welfare Authority, made a complaint through that channel also seem unlikely to succeed. All in all, R7 resolved his predicament in Kincora with some considerable skill.

R7 gave evidence, moreover, that he was present with three other residents in March 1966 when a letter complaining about Mr Mains was composed. He could not recall the contents of the letter but said that the four boys were suspicious that Mr Mains was having a homosexual relationship with R4 (see paragraphs 3.76-3.86). R7 said that the letter was written by a resident, referred to in evidence as R6, and that he saw R6 post the letter to the College Street headquarters in the postbox at the corner of North Road opposite the hostel. R7 stated that he did not tell the other boys about Mr Mains' advances to him nor did they make any allegations to him in respect of any homosexual activity, but his evidence suggested that a general suspicion about Mr Mains existed over and above the specific concern about his relationship with R4. R7 did not become aware of any action resulting from the letter of complaint and the R6 letter did not come to light in the course of the RUC and Terry Inquiry or of our scrutiny of Belfast Welfare Authority files. In fact, R6 was to make a documented complaint against Mr Mains in September 1967 (see paragraphs 3.107-3.124). Since this fell within R7's third period in Kincora, we tried to establish whether his recollection might relate to that complaint. The terms of R6's complaint were put to R7 but he stated that he did not remember it and the fact that R6's 1967 complaint made no reference to R4 tends to suggest that R7's evidence referred to a separate event. It must be said, however, that R7's lack of literacy was an obstacle on this point as it prevented him from recalling the precise terms of the March 1966 letter. We also noted from R6's written complaint of September 1967 that he was barely literate and was, as such, an unfortunate choice to act as scribe. Whether this had a bearing on the letter's actual arrival at its destination, or on what weight attached to

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The Rev. Thompson called to see me at 5.30 p.m. on Tuesday, the 14th August, 1962. He reported a serious affair at the Children's Home, Manor House, Lisburn, involving two of the Committee's children, B3/R1 and Apparently there had been some serious sexual malpractice going on over a period of time. This first came to the Rev. Thompson's notice on the 26th July.

At the first opportunity I had a word with Miss K. Forrest, Children's Inspector, Ministry of Home Affairs, that is, at 10 a.m. on the 16th August, and informed her of the position.

Miss Forrest and the Rev. Thompson called at this office at 2.30 on 16th August when a long discussion took place. Miss Forrest said that she would make further enquiries through Dr. Simpson of the Ministry and Dr. Burns, the Divisional Medical Officer and, in the meantime, the Rev. Thompson said he would arrange for the two "hite boys to be seen at the Child Guidance Clinic.

Mr. Malone, Divisional Welfare Officer, informed me that the two boys could not return home as their father was unable to exercise proper parental control.

I pulled both my trousers and underpants down to my ankles. Joe Mains then struck me across the bare bottom with a cane. I was struck at least six times and was extremely sore".

- A There was a relationship with him but I don't know how it started.

I read another portion from KIN 38 s statement over to Mains. "About a couple of weeks later Joe Mains asked me to go for a drink with him. We went to the Stormont Hotel. This was during an evening. We drank there for about two to three hours and I was drunk. Joe Mains was drinking himself and at closing time we went back to Kincora Hostel. We went into his flat on the ground floor. We had another drink there and Joe Mains asked me to go to bed with him. It was about 12 midnight. We both stripped off all our clothes and got into his bed. He started to masturbate me and then when he finished he asked me to masturbate him which I did. That was all that happened and we both feel asleep as we were fairly drunk. I stayed the night with him in his bed".

- A That is correct, yes, as far as the drinking is concerned. He was over 18, he wasn't under age.
- Q He was a resident at Kincora.

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- A He was a resident back from Borstal.

On one or two occasions his hand slipped inside the waistband of my underpants and I pulled his hand out and told him to 'fuck off'".

I read a second portion from KIN 27's statement over to Mains. "On two occasions he ordered me to make his bed, he took me down to make it and whilst I was in the room which was part of his office he had his hands inside the pockets of his trousers and was quite clearly playing with his privates looking at me. I could see from the front of his trousers that he had an erection, but at no time did he take his penis out of his trousers. I can remember that he said something to me that was suggestive but at the moment I cannot remember what he said. On the second cocasion I started to make the bed up and he started doing the same actions again, so I refused to do

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any more and he ordered me to sweep the lawn instead".

- A No no he may have been asked to make the bed.

I'll always remember that to me it seemed an enormous lump, but as I have said I was only young. He then took my hand and moved it behind my back, he took his penis out and made me masturbate him".

He did not appear to be interested in my trouble, but I realise now what he was after. That was all that happened that night. I remember that probably about two to three months later Mr Mains told me to go up and have a bath. I went up and was having a bath when Mr Mains came in. Belfast, at this address. I then told him of our identity and that
we were two of a number of police officers who were making enquiries into
certain allegations concerning activities within Kincora Boys' Hostel in
which he was employed as a warden. 'I then detained him under Section 2 of
the Criminal Law Act and cautioned him. I then conveyed him to
Mountpottinger RUC Station. At 9 am on the same date and accompanied by
D/Constable McGladdery, I again saw Semple at Mountpottinger RUC Station.
I cautioned him and asked him about his employment in Kincora. He told us that he started working in Kincora in July 1969 and the following questions
were put to him:
Q Did anything improper happen in the home during your time.
A No.
Q Ten years you have been there.
A Yes, could you tell me who these boys are.

The Detective Chief Inspector then left the room at 11.30 am. When the Detective Chief Inspector left the room Semple said to me "That's a nice man" I replied "Yes, he is my boss". I then said to Semple "Would you like to talk to him on his own and Semple replied "No, if I had anything to say I would tell you first, but I'll tell you this, McGrath has been at the boys a long time so he has, I tried to catch him but he was too good for me. This interview then terminated at 11.35 am.

On 1 April 1980 at Mountpottinger Police Station with D/Inspector McClure I interviewed Joseph MAINS, DOB 31.7.29 of Dundonald. The interview commenced at 9.30 am. D/Inspector McClure introduced us to Mains and told him that as a result of allegations in the press relating to homosexual activitiesat Kincora Boys' Hostel, Upper Newtownards Road, Belfast extensive police investigation had been carried out. D/Inspector McClure outlined to him that these allegations also included boys being hired out for prostitution and an alleged cover up by the Department of Health and Social Services. As a result of enquiries and boys interviewed it was evident that homosexual acts and indecent acts with boys had been committed by members of staff at the hostel. Allegations of this nature had also been made against him and the D/Inspector asked him if they were true and cautione him. Mains said, "Nothing like that was going on and he had no idea of it". D/Inspector McClure then asked him to account for his employment in the hostel and the members of staff. He related to us how he had come to Kincora and that he had been working on his own for a long time. He stated that Raymond Semple who was in the St John's Ambulance Brigade used to help out and then became employed as Deputy Warden. He said that Raymond left for

a couple of years however came back again. D/Inspector McClure asked him when McGrath joined the staff and he said, "About 1972". He was asked as far as Semple and McGrath were concerned had he any knowledge of their

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activities. He stated that the time Raymond Semple resigned a boy made allegations that Raymond had interfered with him. He said that he suspected McGrath was involved in something like this but he had no evidence. He was asked how he knew this, he said boys had made complaints and telephone calls had been received. D/Inspector McClure asked Mains to relate the circumstance starting at the beginning of the complaints made against McGrath. Mains said that after McGrath started in the hostel during 1972 a confidential telephone call was received at Strandtown Police Station about McGrath being involved in homosexual activity. Sergeant Bolt sent a Constable up to Kincora and the Constable discussed the matter with Mains. Mains said he had spoken to McGrath about this and McGrath denied being involved. McGrath told him someone in the political field was trying to get his own back and put him out of a job. Mains said he reported this matter to Mr Wilson of the Social Services and he later saw an ad in the paper put in by the police asking the person to come forward who had telephoned a message. The D/Inspector then asked Mains what he knew about McGrath. He said that McGrath was a family man devoted to his wife, was a Christian man and attended Church every Sunday. We discussed with him McGrath's political views and Mains said McGrath belonged to TARA and all he knew about this was that he thought it was connected with the Orange Order. Mains continued by saying McGrath used to hand out leaflets in the hostel. Mains went on to state that a couple of months after the call another confidential call was received at the District Office. This call related to McGrath's homosexual activities. The Senior Social Worker Colin McKay and Mrs Wilson came to Kincora and interviewed McGrath in Mains office. The allegations were put to McGrath and he denied them. He made the same suggestion that someone was out to put him out of the job. Mains told us that around this time he assumed from what had been . talked about that McGrath was being blackmailed by a school teacher in one of the Colleges called Garland. McGrath had mentioned he had to pay out £3,000 and had to sell his house in Greenwood. We then asked Mains about the complaints boys had made. Mains said that R15 had complained that the old fellow meaning McGrath had interfered with him.

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McGrath about this and McGrath replied that he had told R15 to pull up his zip and tidy himself up going out to school. McGrath said he touched

him on the front of the trousers as he told him this. Mains said he mentioned this allegation to Raymond Semple also the domestic staff Mrs

that he had touched him on the private parts. Mains said he spoke to

Smith and Mrs McCullough. He said he also reported it to R15 s Social Worker a woman, he could not remember her name. Mains said that HIA533

HIA533 reported to him that when McGrath was waking him up one morning he slipped his hands under the bedclothes. HIA533 told Mains that he thought McGrath was a bit of a fruit. Mains said he discussed this with

HIA533 and HIA533 said he would handle it himself. Mains decided not to report this however decided to watch McGrath and try and catch him himself. Mains said that his suspicions were getting aroused and had mentioned this to other boys however there was no evidence that McGrath was involved in this way. Mains then told us about R18 He said R18 had come

from and was in a very depressed state. He said R18 and Mr McGrath did not get on very well and R18 complained to him that while in the bathroom putting on medication McGrath had suggested to him that he would put on the cream. McGrath told him he was a proper masseur and asked R18

to remove the towel as he said he would look better. Mains said he personall reported this to District Headquarters and to Anna Hylands R18 s Social Worker. Mrs Hylands and Mr Gordon Higham had a case conference on R18 at

which Mains was present. The allegations were discussed, they all thought was telling lies because of his dislike for McGrath. Mains was asked

did he not feel in view of all these allegations there was some substance in them. Mains said he had his doubts about McGrath and that there was something going on. He again discussed this with the staff however they knew nothing. He said R18 continued to make allegations on several occasions. Mains said he tried to catch McGrath and told the rest of the staff. Mains said he tried to cover McGrath by putting other staff on at the same time, also he changed McGrath's duties so that there were fewer boys in the hostel when McGrath was on. At times Mains said he slipped back

to the hostel about 9 pm however never caught anything on. He said that

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R 18 had told him he was a homosexual and that his Social Worker knew this. Mains said R 18 gay friends used to pick him up at the hostel. After Mrs Hylands left Social Work she became R 18 counsellor. Mains said she is now a Marriage Guidance Counsellor. Peter Martin took over as R 18 Social Worker and Mains spoke to him about these allegations. Martin said what could we do about him. Mains was asked if there were any other complaints, he stated he could not remember if there were. We then told Mains that three boys called R8 R6 and R5 had complained about his behaviour to the Social Services. Mains said there was no truth in the allegations and they were malicious as he had reprimanded these boys. We discussed R5 complaint and he said he did not indecently interfere with him, merely pulled back his underpants to see if they were clean. Mains said that he had trouble with R5 changing his underpants. We then R 9 mentioned complaints made by R7 and For a short time he denied any involvement with them however he then admitted being involved in masturbation with them. R7 in the hostel and on one occasion with R9 in his girlfriend's home. He denied emphatically that anal sex or oral sex had ever taken place. Inspector McClure asked him if any activity like that had occurred with Hugh Quinn and he said just masturbation. This had started when Quinn was in the hostel. We questioned R 7 and him for some time on the allegations made by he wouldn't elaborate on what he had already admitted. D/Inspector McClure told him he was going to have his lunch and advised him to think seriously on the allegations made and also to think of any other occasions he interfered with residents or other persons who we were not aware of. D/Inspector McClure explained to him that a number of boys had not yet been interviewed and if complaints were made against him he would have to be reinterviewed. Mains said he would do this. He stated that his mind was in a turmoil and that he did not know what he was going to tell his family and his girlfriend BAR 1 The interview terminated at12.40pm. At1.45pm that same day

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I again interviewed Jospeh Mains with D/Inspector McClure. He reminded Mains of the caution and the nature of our enquiries.

- D/I Q Did you know of Raymond Semple's activities.
 - A Yes, I told him to cut it out when I heard of it.
- D/I Q How did you find out.
 - A My girlfriend BAR 1 had known Raymond at Williamson House, she told me to watch him.
- D/I Q Did you speak to him at the time.
 - A I did, his mother was in failing health and I said why don't you resign, which he did, then he came back and done a lot of voluntary work and I thought he was alright and had sorted himself out. As far as Raymond was concerned I never saw him do anything.
- D/I Q Did you get any specific allegations about Semple from a boy named B3/R1
 - A Aye I did.
- D/I Q Did you report it.
 - A No I don't think so.
- D/I Q Have you thought of your own situation over lunch.
 - A I have given it some thought and I want to get the thing cleared up.
- D/I Q We spoke this morning concerning boys you had relationships with. What was the situation with R7 and R9 as far as intercourse was concerned.
 - A As far as they were concerned no intercourse took place.
- D/I Q Could you have pushed up against R9 in the bed.
 - A I might have done, I took a whole bottle of whiskey that night.

 You see in a case like mine I would get no gratification from

 intercourse with a man.

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- D/S Q Have you spoken to a Doctor about your problem, you seem to have a good understanding of it.
 - A No I have read books.
- D/S Q What sort.
 - A Sexual deviations and others.
- D/S Q The book we picked up at your home this morning.
 - A Yes.
- D/I Q And you are saying that nothing happened over the last five or six years.
 - A Yes, I got together with BAR 1 and I was getting myself together.
- D/S Q What about other people, a man R2 for instance.
 - A The same thing happened with him masturbation.
- D/S Q Is this
 - A Yes then he said no
- D/S Q Is he a male nurse.
 - A He used to be a male nurse in Musgrave Park.
- D/S Q Did you have sex with him.
 - A No I don't think so unless there was drink involved.
- D/S Q How long ago was this.
 - A About ten years.
- D/S Q You keep saying if there was drink involved, you keep making this proviso, don't you.
 - A I have been through a lot these last weeks, the strain of what has happened, I can't remember things clearly.
- D/S Q It is quite apparent that you and R2 had more than just masturbation with each other and you are going to have to come to terms with it.

Mains made no reply.

D/S Q Do you feel there is nothing wrong with this. Mains made no reply.

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- D/I Q Do you still see R2.
 - A Rarely.
- D/S Q You have his telephone number in your desk directory.
 - A Yes, I speak to him on occasions.
- D/I Q You had a sexual relationship with him.
 - A You mean intercourse, no.
- D/S Q What about to put it crudely, sucking him off.
 - A Yes that happened with R2
- D/I Q With anyone else.
 - A No.
- D/I Q How did this relationship start.
 - A He had been boarded out and didn't like the people he was with so he used to come back to the hostel at night and it started like that.
- D/I Q What about Quinn.
 - A No intercourse happened with him, he stayed last Christmas for a week.
- D/I Q During the middle sixties did anything happen with anyone else other than KIN 4
 - A No, no one only him.
- D/I Q Do you think that if you tell us that you had intercourse with someone it's more serious than just masturbation.
 - A Yes I'm worried about the whole thing.
- D/S Q We are still left with the position that this sexual intercoursing is a stumbling block with you, it makes me think you did it but can't just say it out loud.
 - A I can't just remember any intercourse taking place.
- D/S Q You say that the relationship with R2 went on for ten years, I think that intercourse did take place between you, it's a natural progression from masturbation isn't it.
 - A I don't think so, it's not my way of doing things.

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STATEMENT OF: JOHN MIDDLEMISS CONTINUATION PAGE NO:

- D/S Q Was it
 - A I don't know.
- D/S Q I don't suppose you were always drunk when you were with R 2 were you.
 - A Most times.
- D/I Q When was the last time you had a relationship with
 - A It's a long time back now towards the end of last year.
- D/S Q Was he the last person you had dealings with.
 - A Yes.
- D/I Q Did he or any of the others have a hold over you or threaten you.
 - A No they didn't but I feared sometimes they might.
- D/I Q It still leaves us with a position that people have made statements saying you had intercourse with them and while you admit masturbating with them you deny this act.
 - A I get no satisfaction from sexual intercourse.
- D/S Q How do you know that if you have never tried it.
 - A It's never appealed to me.
- D/I Q Could it have happened without you fully realising it after a drink for instance.
 - A It could have done I suppose, I used to take a lot of drink I wasn't an alcoholic but I took a lot, but I didn't think anything like that happened.
- D/I Q Would you find it hard to admit if you had done it.
 - A I would yes.
- D/I Q Why.
 - A I find it dirty.
- D/I Q Is it more dirty than sucking people.
 - A I don't know, never to my knowledge did intercourse happen. Mains then paused and said, "Unless I had a lot of drink and didn't know what was happening".

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STATEMENT OF: JOHN MIDDLEMISS CONTINUATION PAGE NO: 9

- D/S Q You always clarify your answer don't you, you are always at the drink aspect.
 - A Do I.
- D/S Q Yes because if you are honest you know intercourse happened and are trying to cover yourself aren't you.

 Mains made no reply.
- D/I Q Did you hire out boys to other men for them to have sex.
 - A No way, never.
- D/I Q Was anybody else obtaining money for sex acts at the hostel.
 - A No I am certain they weren't.
- D/I Q Did anyone in the hostel obtain money for acts of sex.
 - A Not to my knowledge.
- D/I Q Let's return to the intercourse aspect of this. Did you ever get threatened by anyone in view of your relationships to have anal sex.
 - A I always had a feeling about R 2 when he lived in I felt that if I turned him away he would have made allegations.
- D/I Q Isn't it right you had intercourse with R 2
 - A Yes.
- D/I Q Isn't it right you enjoyed it.
 - A I was horrified.
- D/I Q Then you did do it.
 - A Yes, it's a funny life isn't it.
- D/I Q Did R 2 put his penis into your backside or did you put it in his.
 - A Both.
- D/I Q Whose suggestion was it.
 - A I can't remember.
- D/I Q When did it happen.
 - A About eight to ten years ago.

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STATEMENT OF: JOHN MIDDLEMISS

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- D/I Q Did this happen with the masturbation.
 - A Yes.
- D/I Q As far as R 2 was concerned it didn't start with Kincora.
 - A No he had been out about a year I think.
- D/I Q How did it start.
 - A He was telling me that he had started this in the army and had been discharged on medical grounds and we discussed his problems about girls and it just started.
- D/I Q What about R7
 - A I can't remember it ever happening with him, just the masturbation.
- D/I Q What about R9
 - A I can't remember it happening with the state of course but then he would have known.
- D/I Q was the first person you had anal sex with
 - A No it was Quinn.
- D/I Q When he was in the hostel.
 - A Yes during '63 or '64.
- D/I Q Did it happen when he came back to visit.
 - A No.
- D/I Q How often did you do it.
 - A Several occasions while he lived in the hostel.
- D/I Q Did he enter you or you him.
 - A Me with him.
- D/S Q Tell me isn't it right that the full act appeals to you as much as masturbation.
 - A No it didn't.
- D/S Q You said R2 might have made allegations about you, what about Quinn.
 - A I think he used me and the situation as an easy way through Kincora.
- D/I Q In Quinn's case how did it start, do you remember.
 - A No I can't.

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- D/I Q. Is there anyone else you had a full relationship with.
 - A No.
- D/I Q Did you use creams.
 - A Not necessarily no.
- D/I Q What do you mean, yes or no.
 - A I never bothered with them, no.
- D/I Q Do you remember KIN66
 - A He was a hostel assistant, he only stayed when Semple left during 1968 I think.
- D/I Q Is R5 s complaint right.
 - A No. I only checked his underwear, he was a guy who was never changing and I pulled his pants back and looked at them when he was in the bathroom to see if they were clean.
- D/I Q Did he have trousers on.
 - A No he didn't.
- D/S Q Did you give R5 a hiding when he told you he had reported the incident to the Welfare.
 - A He got a hiding yes, I used a cane.
- D/I Q Why did you think he made the allegations.
 - A These boys had a personal grudge against me and they concocted this to get back at me.
- D/I Q Did anything happen with Richard Kerr.
 - A No.

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- D/I Q What about R8
 - A R8 came to the hostel after R5 and had been employed in the brothers shop, I think he was stealing cigarettes, I think he did this to get back at me.
- D/I Q Did he rub cream in your back.
 - A Yes but nothing else happened.
- D/I Q Did you give him a French kiss.

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A No, he came down to my room one night about half past two and complained about another boy R34 who had made advances to him. Says I you can stay down here if you're frightened and he slept for a while in a chair then decided to get into bed with me. I had my trousers on and he had his clothes on too but nothing of a sexual nature happened.

D/I Q What about KIN 46

A No.

D/I Q KIN 4 did anything happen

D/Inspector McClure then read out a section of KIN 4 statement referring to Mains. Mains replied, "No no the bathroomyou had to supervise sometimes but I never did that no".

- D/I Q What did Quinn do for a living.
 - A He's a Mini taxi-cab driver.
- D/I Q Have you ever had a relationship with a GPO telephonist working in London.
 - A Quinn lives with a telephonist.
- D/I Q Did any Kincora boy work as a telephonist in London.
 - A Quinn he worked as a telephonist for a time.
- D/I Q Do you remember KIN 29
 - A Yes I do.
- D/I Q Did you tell him about your relationship with Quinn.
 - A I don't think so.
- D/I Q He says you did.
 - A No I don't think so.
- D/I Q Did you ever visit Quinn in London.
 - A Yes but I never stayed with him. I stayed in the YMCA.
- D/I Q Do you know a KIN 92
 - A Yes, he's an ex Kincora boy, he visited me with his wife. He telephoned the hostel recently and told KIN 336 he wanted to thank me for putting him on the right track.

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- Q What about HIA 534 / R 4.
- A The first encounter I had with HIA 534/R4 was that he wouldn't wash and I was bathing him. I threw him in the bath, he would make allegations about me I think.
- D/S Q Why would he.
 - A I don't know he's a bit simple.
- D/I Q Did anything happen between you.
 - A No.
- D/I Q Did anything else take place with any boys we haven't mentioned.
 - A No I don't think so.
- D/S Q Are you saying you can't remember any other boys or that it didn't happen with other boys.
 - A I can't remember any other boys.
- D/I Q Would you have felt round boys that were having baths.
 - A All the boys, not at all.
- D/I Q How did it start with
 - A He was having a bath, he had nits in his hair and I was washing it. He had an erection, and it started from there.
- D/I Q Masturbation.
 - A Yes.
- D/I Q Did you masturbate him or he you.
 - A Me him he didn't masturbate me.

D/Inspector McClure then read over to Mains the complaints made against McGrath from statements regarding KIN 46 D/Inspector said Do you know of this?" Mains replied, "No, no". Regarding R12 D/Inspector said, "Do you remember R12 coming to see you?"

- A Yes I do.
- D/I Q Did R 12 make any complaint to you.
 - A No he never.

Regarding KIN 44 D/Inspector said, "Do you remember KIN 44 asking to leave?"

A Yes He was always unsettled, he was a poor worker and always wanted to be out.

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STATEMENT OF: JOHN MIDDLEMISS CONTINUATION PAGE NO: 14 Regarding R9 D/Inspector said, "Do you remember the massaging?" Yes. D/I Q And the masturbation. Yes. Q What about the intercourse in the bedroom. D/I A No I can't remember that. Q What about downstairs in the living room. D/I A No it never happened nothing happened that night at all. D/I Q Did he suck you off. A No, look the first time he stayed after the decorating finished I asked him to get me a glass of whiskey, not brandy, I don't drink brandy. I was lying on the floor and I have got a bad back and I asked him to rub some cream in and he rubbed it round my sides and that's how he started to masturbate me. Q Did you try to have sex with him. D/I O The second time he went to your house what happened. D/I A Nothing happened. Q Did you know that he had a relationship with McGrath. D/I Q Did you know that R9 had a relationship. D/I A Yes some of the boys told me. and HIA 534/R4 had a relationship. Q Did you know 189 D/I A No. with McGrath. ର୍ R17 D/I A I think the wee fellow McMaster was inclined that way you know. Q Did you know about R17 and D/I A No. In respect of R18 D/Inspector McClure said "Did you know about this?" A Yes, let's get R18 into perspective, he only thought he was above everybody at the hostel and would only talk to the staff. SIGNATURE of STATEMENT MAKER

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He was very depressed and I used to have long conversations with him and one time he told me that McGrath had told him he was a qualified masseur and had massaged creams into R18 s back. I felt that R18 was making this story up as he had an intense dislike of McGrath, and one time R18 told me that he was gay from when he was ten and this was the reason he couldn't mix with the rest of the boys. I told his Social Worker what he had said and she continued to counsel him. His relationship became more pleasant with McGrath and we had a case conference. At the conference it was discussed and it was decided to make him mix with the other boys and not make him feel that he was of any importance. I discussed McGrath with Mrs Hylands R18 s Social Worker and we couldn't make our minds up whether it was true or not, although I think she believed

D/Inspector McClure left the interview room at 3.50 pm. I then said to Mains concerning R22 did he ever complain.

A No I was never told about that.

D/S Q R10 did you know.

A I didn't know about that some of the boys had suggested it.

D/S Q Did you ask McGrath about it.

A No I decided just to watch and see what happened. was an older boy and could have taken care of himself.

D/S Q Richard Millar.

A He didn't report it to me.

D/S Q He said he did.

A I would have remembered.

D/S Q Clinton Massey.

A That wasn't reported to me.

D/S Q KIN300 he saw R9 and R17 together.

A He told me that they were two fruits and had been in bed together.

I questioned both of them.

- D/S Q What did you do about it.
 - A I told them off and separated them into different bedrooms.
- D/S Q KIN 5
 - A No that didn't happen.
- D/S Q Did you hit him for stealing money.
 - A No he was caned, I didn't punch him.
- D/Inspector McClure returned to the interview room at 4.08 pm.
- D/S Q R21
 - A He never complained to me he was very secretive. He wouldn't have told me.
- D/I Q KIN 43
 - A I can't remember that, it's a good while back.
- D/I Q There was another HIA 532/B1/R13 I haven't got his statement here.

 Do you remember him reporting an incident with McGrath.
 - A No.
- D/S Q Richard Kerr, what was your relationship with him.
 - A Good always very good.
- D/S Q Did you know Kerr's friend KIN 340
 - A This was supposed to be his uncle.
- D/S Q Kerr was involved in burglaries he discussed these things with you.
 - A Yes, that's right he told me after he had been caught.
- D/I Q Did he complain about McGrath.
 - A I asked about McGrath when he was in Rathgael when he was in Training School and he told me that McGrath tried it on him several times.
- D/I Q Did you question McGrath.
 - A Not at that time I thought if Richard Kerr had anything to say he would say it himself.
- D/S Q Do you know KIN 250
 - A No.

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STATEMENT OF: JOHN MIDDLEMISS CONTINUATION PAGE NO:

D/I Q You visited Kerr in Borstel.

- A Yes, he wrote several times to me to visit him, he thought because he had been sent down the hostel had not stood by him.
- D/I Q Did you know Eric Witchell from Williamson House.
 - A Yes.
- D/I Q Why did you visit Kerr.
- A To ease the situation, we would visit if requested by the boy. D/Inspector McClure left the room again at 4.25 pm.
- D/S Q You didn't visit because you thought he could have said something about you which would have been embarrassing.
 - A Oh no no.
- D/S Q How did you become involved with Kerr.
 - A He was the sort of boy that involved himself in you, talking to you that sort of thing. He regarded me as a father figure at that time. He didn't like McGrath and couldn't relate too well to Raymond.

D/Inspector McClure returned to the interview room at 4.30 pm. D/Inspector McClure showed Mains Exhibit Number GC 21 Part of GC 3 a statement made by D/Inspector McClure read it over to Mains and Mains said R6

there was nothing in that no. D/Inspector McClure showed Mains Exhibit GC 24 Part of GC 1 a letter by R8 D/Inspector read it over to him, Mains made no comment. Inspector McClure showed Mains Exhibit Number GC 19 Part of GC 3 a letter by R8 . Mains was told that this was virtually a copy of the first letter. He was then shown Exhibit GC 20 A Part of GC 3 a statement by R5

- D/I Q Are you saying that the allegations made by these boys are untrue.
 - A Yes there was nothing of a sexual nature going on as they seemed to describe.

Mains was shown Exhibit GC 50 a file on himself. D/Inspector McClure pointed out references were in his own handwriting and asked him why.

A It's just that if I had sent the originals I might not have got them back, I have got them at the house I think.

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 ${\tt D/Inspector}$ McClure pointed out type-written copies of references and asked Who typed these.

- A I don't remember.
- D/I Q As far as TARA was concerned did McGrath tell you about it.
 - A He left a lot of leaflets about the hostel and I asked him about it and he told me that it was a Christian organisation based on the crowning stone in the Republic where the Kings of Ireland were crowned. That's all I know of it.

 - A As far as I was concerned I had no proof so I thought the best thing was to relate it to my seniors.

D/Inspector left the room at 4.45 pm.

 - A To manage control and supervise boys and staff, processing them employment, attending Juvenile Courts when required, that's it.

I then showed Mains Exhibit SGP 1 a report on R18. I cautioned him and said, "What's this". He replied "A copy of a confidential report which I sent to the Eastern Health and Social Services regarding a complaint by R18 made about McGrath".

My mother and father separated when I was about seven years old. My father couldn't manage my three sisters, my brother and myself so all five of us were put into care. I had been living at put in Marmon House, Holywood, with my brother BM21 he was younger than me. I stayed there for about four years. It was a mixed home run by women. Both my brother and I were transferred to Manor House, Lisburn, when I was about eleven. We stayed there for two or three years until I was about thirteen or fourteen years old. During my time in these homes I attended school. When I was about fourteen I transferred with my brother to the boys' hostel at Bawnmore. When I first went to Bawnmore, BM3, the officer-in-charge was living in with his wife. His assistant, S1 lived somewhere in Road. BM3 moved into a house in the grounds which was built during the first few months I was there and other men including a R17 who used to help BM3 part-time. About a fortnight to three weeks after I went to Bawnmore I was having a bath. The bathroom was on the first landing. I was having a bath when the door opened and S1 walked in. He closed the door behind him and locked it. He asked me if he could bath me but I told him I was old enough

to bath myself. He then took the facecloth and started bathing me. He rubbed the cloth over my body and round my balls. He then said that he was going to take his trousers off and get into the bath with me. I objected but he took his trousers and underpants off anyway. After he took them off he asked me to wank him. I could see he had a hard on. He said that if I didn't give it a wank I would be put to bed. I was scared and I wanked him till he came. While I was wanking him he was feeling round my balls. When he finished he left the bathroom. When I finished my bath I went to BM3 and told him that S1 was interfering with me in the bath. I used the word interfering and didn't tell him about wanking S1 BM3 asked me what I meant by interfering and I told him that he was interfering with my body. For the next few weeks BM3 became very friendly with me and would take me to the Lido Picture House. One day about three weeks after I wanked him in the bathroom he said to me would you do that again what we done in the bathroom. I told him no, and so he ordered me to go to bed without any tea. I went to my bed and didn't get any tea that evening. It was about four o'clock that he sent me to bed. During that night about nine or ten o'clock when the boys were watching TV he came to my room and asked me if I would go to his bedroom. I was scared so I went to his bedroom with him. He told me to take my pyjamas off and he took his trousers down. He wanted me to give him a wank. I gave him a wank until he came. He was feeling all over me during this. I then went back to bed. I told S1 before I went back to bed that I was going to tell BM3 about it and the next day I told BM3 because he was off at nights. BM3 just said that he would see S1 about it. After this S1 got very friendly with me and would take me everywhere with him and the boys would keep me going about it and call me a fruit merchant. They had warned me that S1 was one. After wanking S1 in his bedroom on five or six different occasions, he put vaseline on my arse hole and on his cock and he tried to put it in me. It hurt so I told him to stop it. He told me it wouldn't hurt and he kept on

After he finished he gave me a S1 facecloth and soap and I went to the bathroom and washed myself. used to take me to his bedroom about once or twice a month at two or three in the morning and he would want me to wank him and sometimes he would ride me. He wakened me in the dormitory and the other boys must have known what was going on and I think he was doing it with some of them too. Some of the other boys names were R7 , KIN 189 and his brother, KIN and I can't remember any more. I remember playing football that sometimes would take me into the bushes and get me to wank him. He used into the bushes as well. I told BM3 about to take S1 interfering with me on four or five occasions but as nothing was done about it I got fed up and stopped complaining to BM3 . I can't remember having any social worker come to see me and I never told anybody else about S1 I left Bawnmore when I was about sixteen and went to . I didn't get on with live with my father at the woman my father was going to marry and only lived with him for about a year. I was then put into Kincora Boys' Hostel on the Upper Newtownards Road when I was seventeen. When I went there Joe Mains was in charge and Raymond Semple was his deputy. I was put in a dormitory on the first floor on the left hand side with a fellow KIN 167 who is dead now and KIN 167 died in a drowning accident while on holidays. After a couple of days in the hostel told me to watch Joe Mains and Raymond Semple because they would interfere with you. About a fortnight after I was in Joe Mains called me into his bedroom and asked me to give him a wank. I said no and he said come on I was told you do that sort of thing. I then thought that S1 must have told Mains because I had seen him up visiting Mr Mains and they used to go out together. I wanked Mains and he felt all round my balls. This was after we had both stripped. As I wasn't at school or working I used to do jobs about the hostel and nearly every afternoon when Mr Mains and I were on our own, Mains would wank me in his bedroom and I

would wank him. He never rid me, and I wouldn't ride him. I always objected but he would threaten to stop my pocket money or put me to bed early. About

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four weeks after I started wanking Mains, Raymond Semple spoke to me one day when I was vacuuming the bedroom and said that I was to give him a wank because if I could do it to Joe Mains I could do it to him. We just pulled our trousers down and wanked each other. After that both Mr Mains and Mr Semple were getting me to wank them, I think it was a toss up to see who would get me first. After a while Semple started to take me to his bedroom and put vaseline on his cock and my arse and then ride me. When he put his cock in my arse it hurt me at first but as the weeks went by it got easier. After a couple of weeks he asked me ride him and I did. All this would occur in Semple's bedroom and it happened nearly every day or night. We would ride each other and we would both come in each other. Up until I left Kincora both Mains and Semple were interfering with me. I can remember that Mr Mains used to have male friends visit him in Kincora. Sometimes these men would watch TV with the boys or stay in Mr Mains' bedroom with him. One of these men, I think he was an ex Kincora boy, used to visit Mr Mains about once every two or three months. One night I was in bed and at two o'clock in the morning this man came to my bed and got in and said that Joe Mains had sent him. I told him very politely to fuck off. He stayed on and in the end we wanked each other. This happened about three or four times and always at two or three in the morning. This man was about 5'10" tall, ginger or fair hair, about 30 years old. He said he was a friend of Joe Mains and had to go to England on jobs. I can't remember his name at the minute. I told nobody about what happened to me in Kincora. I saw no social workers during my stay. I left Kincora when I was eighteen and went back to my father but we didn't get on so I got a flat and left him. The flat was at Upper Newtownards Road. After I left Kincora I stayed friendly with Raymond Semple as we were both stewards at the Oval football matches. We would travel together on the away matches and would wank each other in the toilets of the train. He would visit me in my flat on his nights off and we would ride each other in my bed. Sometimes he would stay all night and other times he would go back to the hostel. I never saw Joe Mains after leaving Kincora and the last time I had sex with Raymond Semple was about two years before I was married in 1976. I forgot to tell you that Joe Mains used to

information. In his interview with B3/R1 he formed the impression that the information being supplied by B3/R1, that he was used in a homosexual vice ring by Joseph Mains in the Bangor area, was unreliable and could not form the basis for a newspaper story.

CONCLUSION

369. To date no evidence has been forthcoming to indicate that Joseph Mains was involved in a homosexual vice ring in the Bangor area. White may have been motivated by the prospect of monetary gain.

SPECIAL CONSTABLE JAMES PATTON

- On 1 March 1982, D/Constable James CULLEN, Donegall Pass RUC Station reported to D/Sergeant Elliott that William McGrath was very friendly with Special Constable James PATTON who was attached to Donegall Pass in the 1970s. D/Constable Cullen was interviewed by D/Inspector Mack on 22 July 1982 and confirmed this.
- Enquiries revealed that James Patton was engaged as a full-time Special Constable in 3 periods between 8 April 1957 and 7 December 1975, serving mostly in the Belfast area until his retirement from Donegall Pass Police Station on 7 December 1975. I have never had homosexual relations with anybody except MAINS, SEMPLE and has never offered me to any other men for homosexual or any other I do not know of MAINS knowing any R.U.C., Justices of the Peace, businessmen or people from the Northern Ireland office. addition, R2 agreed in evidence that he took as much care as possible keep his sexual relationship with Mr Mains a secret while he was a resident of Kincora, by going to his room late at night for instance. Similarly, after he left Kincora he entered Mr Mains' flat in the hostel through a side door and left without being seen by the residents.

3.71 We were led to the same conclusion in respect of R2 as we were in respect of R3, namely that Mr Mains' offences involving R2 could not have been detected by the responsible authorities on the evidence to which they had access. Again we would stress that no criticism of R2 is implied in this finding. We accept his evidence that he felt isolated and alone in the world and that Mr Mains assumed a central and dominant place in his life. We are satisfied that this was the reason for his continuing a homosexual relationship with Mr Mains, extending over twenty years according to his own evidence. R2 did not have an alternative focus in his life, such as R3 had in Mrs Wilson, and it appears that he chose to accept the sexual element in this relationship as the price for some degree of friendship and companionship. The reasons for which he and R3, who we believe were suspicious of each other's relationship with Mr Mains, decided to remain silent rather than seek to make a concerted complaint have been fully described. They are eminently understandable in human terms.

Evidence of former resident B3

- 3.72 B3 had been in Bawnmore Boys' Home before being admitted to Kincora and the evidence relating to his time there is considered in paragraphs 6.24-6.30. He was admitted to Kincora in February 1965 when he was sixteen years of age. Mr Semple was convicted on two counts of buggery and one of gross indecency involving B3. One of the buggery counts related to a period after B3's discharge from the hostel. Nolle prosequi was entered in respect of one count of gross indecency involving B3 with which Mr Mains was charged.
- 3.73 B3 gave evidence that, about three weeks after he went to Kincora, Mr Mains came into the bathroom and asked B3 to masturbate him, saying that he knew he did that sort of thing. B3 attributed this remark to the fact that a member of the Bawnmore staff, referred to in evidence as S1, had visited Kincora on a number of occasions although B3 had no dealings with him at these times. For the record, the RUC investigations from January 1980 produced no allegation of homosexual misconduct against S1

involving Kincora residents. It is also possible that Mr Mains had become aware of B3's previous sexual activities, which were recorded on his file, from some other source. B3 stated that homosexual activity with Mr Mains continued after this first encounter. He went on to say that, about four to six weeks after his admission to the hostel, a homosexual relationship began with Mr Semple which included anal intercourse and this continued after he left the hostel in May 1966 until the summer of 1974.

- 3.74 B3 did not complain to anyone about the homosexual activities of Messrs Mains and Semple and told us that there was nobody to whom to complain. He said that he could not recall having had a Social Welfare Officer at Kincora. During his evidence as regards his time at Bawnmore, he said that he did not complain to his father about S1's alleged activities because he did not think that his father cared about him and that he never saw his brother or three sisters after he left Bawnmore in 1963. He also told us that, although he knew that Mr Semple's activities were a criminal offence, it did not occur to him to complain to the police. In evidence he said that he was ashamed of this relationship and feared that he himself might be in trouble if he reported it to the police.
- 3.75 We concluded that the offences with which Messrs Mains and Semple were charged could not have been detected on the information available or accessible to the Belfast Welfare Authority. There is no evidence that B3 displayed any signs of distress or anxiety which might have been taken as significant by an outside observer. Indeed the continuation of the relationship with Mr Semple for over seven years after his discharge from the hostel would suggest that B3 viewed homosexual activity with a degree of acceptance. The absence of regular visiting by a Social Welfare Officer was a regrettable feature of the system prevailing at the time, but we do not accept B3's evidence that he would have complained to a Social Welfare Officer. His history from before his admission to Bawnmore and his extended relationship with Mr Semple indicate that he did not have such an aversion to homosexual activity as might have motivated a complaint at that time.

Evidence of former resident R4

3.76 R4 was received into care at the age of four, by a Welfare Authority other than Belfast, his parents having separated. Two of his four brothers and

Apart from the Mason Investigation File and D/Constable Cullen's enquiry, which were brought to the attention of the Director and the Assistant Director of the Eastern Health and Social Services Board, all other matters were dealt with at District level by Mr Clive Scoular, the District Social Services Officer.

583. All persons involved, including police, have made statements in relation to their actions at the time, and no evidence has been found to support any criminal charges regarding this aspect of the investigation.

CHARGES

- 584. Although there is strong pressure by the Northern Ireland Gay Rights Association and through the European Courts, to have the Law in Northern Ireland brought into line with that in the rest of the United Kingdom, it is still an offence for male persons of any age to commit homosexual acts.
- 585. It is considered that in view of the recommendations at paragraph 41 that all residents and former residents be granted immunity from prosecution in respect of offences committed by them with the defendants, Mains, Semple and McGrath, and that this should be extended to include offences committed with each other and other adult males not connected with Kincora.
- 586. The exception to this should be the indecent assault admitted by HIA 534/R 4 on the eight year old boy, KIN 62

- 3.85 Given R4's difficulties about making a complaint, there remained the question of whether the alleged homosexual offences might have been otherwise detected. The unavailability of a personal file, to which attribute no sinister significance, was a hindrance in this respect as denied us any Welfare Authority documents relating to R4. He gave evidence, however, that he kept his homosexual experiences secret from other residents and from other visitors to the hostel because Mr Mains the man in charge. We were driven to the same conclusion in respect of the detectability of any offences by Mr Mains involving R4 as we reache in respect of R3 and R2; namely that there is no evidence to indicate the the responsible authorities could have discovered the offences. We gave particular consideration to R4's evidence as to the nature of visits by his Social Welfare Officer, which was that Mr Mains was always in attendance. We make no criticism of the unidentified Social Welfare Officer on this score, particularly as there is no evidence that she had any reason to regard Mr Mains as other than a trusted colleague. However, we noted the issue as of some importance for future
- 3.86 No criticism attaches to R4 on account of his failure to complain. He was a minor in statutory care and a rather backward boy who may not have been entirely aware of the significance of what was happening to him but was nonetheless embarrassed by it. As such he fell into a pattern similar to that revealed by the evidence of other former residents. A reluctance to complain, together with varying degrees of compliance and concealment, all based on perfectly understandable reasons given the circumstances of the boys, prevented offences from coming to the attention of the responsible authorities. Taking this into account along with the fact that social work was at a relatively early stage of its development, it is possible to feach some understanding of how offences went undetected in the first half of the 1960s.

Evidence of former resident R7

3.87 R7 was received into care by the Belfast Welfare Authority at the age of eleven following an appearance in the Juvenile Court. His father and grandmother were suffering from mental illness and his mother and grandfather were unable to look after him. He lived in two residential

- children's homes in Belfast before transferring to Kincora at the age of fifteen. R7 was slow at school and was unable to read or write.
- 3.88 R7 was admitted to Kincora in August 1964 and discharged from it in

 January 1968. Mr Mains was convicted on one count of indecent assault and

 Mr Semple on one count of gross indecency involving R7. When seeking

 representation for their client, R7's legal representatives indicated that

 he was considering legal proceedings against the Eastern Health & Social

 Services Board as successors to the Belfast Welfare Authority, the

 Department of Health and Social Services and Mr Mains.
- 3.89 R7's evidence in relation to homosexual offences while at Kincora was contained in his 1980 police statement. This described two indecent assaults by Mr Mains, about a week apart, some three months after R7's arrival at the hostel; also acts of gross indecency by Mr Semple in 1966, occurring when R7 got out of the bath. R7 gave evidence that he did not consent to these homosexual acts, that he thought they were dirty, and that he pulled away from Mr Mains when he made his approaches to him. R7 spent three periods in Kincora. The first from August 1964 to December 1965 after which he was placed with foster parents; then from March 1966 to September 1966; and finally from November 1966 to January 1968. Mr Mains' offences were committed during R7's first period in the hostel; and although R7 gave evidence to us that there were no homosexual incidents during his second stay, Mr Semple's conviction in fact related to this period. What is clear, however, is that nothing untoward occurred during his third period. Towards the end of 1966 R7 had been placed on probation and a condition of his probation was that he remained resident in Kincora.
- 3.90 R7 also alleged that, about six months after he first went to Kincora, Mr Mains gave him a severe beating with a stair rod for running round the hostel and causing a commotion. This was in excess of the limits of corporal punishment permitted by the 1952 SR and O. There is no evidence that this matter came to the attention of the Belfast Welfare Authority.
- 3.91 R7 did not make any direct complaint on his own account about the homosexual activities of Messrs Mains and Semple. While he was in contact with his family, his statement to us referred to the mental illness of his

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pulled back my foreskin. He said that because there was no scum there it wasn't because of that I was thin. He left the bathroom just after that. On another occasion I walked into Joe's office without knocking the door. In the office were Joe and HIA 534/R4. They had each others hands on the others shoulders and were kissing each other on the lips. I walked straight out again. He never said anything to me about that incident. I don't think he saw me enter the office. One time a sum of money went missing from a boy's locker. I think the boy's name was Warden. Mains accused me for taking it. There was a 50/50 chance it was me but on that occasion it wasn't. Joe tackled me in the hallway just outside the dining-room. He said he was going to get the Police. I told him to go ahead. At this, he punched me several times. He floored me and continued punching me. This was done in full view of a cleaner who was close by. She contacted the Welfare and my social worker, Mrs Brown came to Kincora. She talked to me and told me that it was corporal punishment and my conversation with her led me to believe that she was backing his action at that time. It was a known fact in the hostel that Mains was a queer. There were numerous visitors to the hostel but I don't know if any stayed or not. No other approaches of an indecent nature were made to me during my time there. You have asked me about a man called McGrath. I can't place anybody of that name at Kincora when there.

 (KIMS 26) also refers to a man walking into his room during the night at Christmas 1979, although nothing untoward apparently took place on that occasion but the intruder was almost certainly Hugh QUINN who we know was staying at Kincora over that Christmas period.
- 41. Each summer in July the staff and residents of Kincora holiday under canvas at Magilligan Camp. In 1965 a boy named KIN167 drowned whilst on holiday with them. According to HIA 534/R4 (KIMS 30-34 SPS 19) he was upset over the drowning incident and shared MAINS' tent that night when grossly indecent acts took place between them.
- When viewing the activities that were taking place at Kincora involving so many boys, it is difficult for an investigator to believe that persons in authority did not know or suspect what was taking place. Yet the witnesses providing the evidence covering this period give no indication that any complaint was made by any of the victims to anyone in authority other than MAINS or SEMPLE at Kincora hostel. As I have indicated in paragraph 15 despite the sordid activities of the men with some of the boys at Kincora, the parties concerned apparently concealed their sexual activities not only from outside visitors but from other Kincora residents, many of whom were sexually naive youngsters.
- 43. Two such witnesses are $\overline{\text{KIN7}}$ (KINMS 113-114 SPS 22) and $\overline{\text{KIN8}}$ (KINMS 94 SPS 23). They were

resident more or less consecutively from May to October 1965 but apparently knew nothing of what was taking place, although as indicated in the foregoing paragraphs a great many offences were being committed.

recalled, however, that on one occasion MAINS administered punishment after KIN7 's late return to Kincora one night by smacking him on his bare bottom.

45. SEMPLE was interviewed by Detective Sergeant W.A. GRAHAM (not related to Detective Superintendent GRAHAM - see paragraphs 201-223 of this report) under caution and was told by SEMPLE that he had committed offences on B3/R1 (buggery and gross indecency), and (gross indecency only). He also stated that MAINS spoke to him about his relationship with B3/R1 and told him to stop, although according to SEMPLE the talk was that MAINS was handling the boys himself. SEMPLE was charged with committing an act of gross indecency with R7 initially, but when submitting his report to the Director of Public Prosecutions Detective Chief Inspector CASKEY recommended (KIDPP 599) that this charge be withdrawn, albeit replacing it with a charge of indecent assault on R7 arising from the same incident.

46. The detail of what took place as described by R7 was that SEMPLE habitually insisted on drying R7 after the boy had had a bath, requiring R7 to face SEMPLE whilst SEMPLE rubbed R7 s bottom with a towel and all the while held R7 close to him and pushing himself against R7. Obviously in

these circumstances a charge of indecent assault or gross indecency would seem to apply equally. The Director of Public Prosecutions decided against altering the charge and when SEMPLE eventually appeared before the court in December 1981 he pleaded guilty to all the charges against him, including the offence on R7

MAINS was questioned by the Royal Ulster Constabulary

officers about his activities during the time SEMPLE worked with him in 1965. He denied the allegation made by KN4 which amounted to at least a technical indecent assault (KTMS 318). MAINS was also questioned about his activities with B3/R1 (KIMS 327). He denied that he had committed any offences with B3/R1 The facts were reported to the Director of Public Prosecutions who directed that MAINS be charged with gross indecency against B3/R1 It was a charge that was unlikely to succeed because in essence it was one man's word against another's concerning incidents that were said to have taken place some 15 years earlier and which had not previously been subject to complaint by the person who was now complaining. In the event MAINS still denied the allegation on 16th December 1981 when he pleaded guilty to six out of ten charges. Quite properly, in my view, the Prosecution followed the usual practice when an accused is prepared to plead guilty to a number of similar offences and did not pursue the matters to which MAINS pleaded not guilty - the item was left on the file. My comments in paragraphs

22 & 23 apply equally to the Royal Ulster Constabulary's investigation

of the period when SEMPLE first joined MAINS in residence at Kincora.

I have been under Welfare Care since I was aged about seven years. I first was in Nazareth Lodge for about four years and then went to De La Salle Boys Home, Kircubbin. When I was about fifteen years of age which was about July 1966 I was sent to Kincora Boys Hostel, Upper Newtownards Road, Belfast. I remember when I went there Mr Joe Mains was in charge. The only other member of the staff there was a young man who came to work there for a short time but got the sack. I can't remember this other person's name, I think it was HIA 534 / R 4, he used to ride a motorcycle and came to the Hostel to stay there while Joe Mains was out. You have told me about the allegations of homosexual activity at the Hostel involving members of the staff interfering with the boys. As far as I am concerned no one interfered with me apart from one night I came in late. I remember I went to bed and I was lying in my bed. I was just wearing my underpants. I remember Joe Mains coming into my room. He asked me if I had got my wages and he told me to come down stairs to his office as he wanted to make up the books. I remember _ now thinking back that Mains put his hand down under the bedclothes. I pushed him away and got up. He did not touch me but I knew he was a bit queer that way. I was placed by the Social Services in Kincora Boys Hostel, Upper Newtownards Road, just after leaving school at Easter 1967. In all I lived in the Hostel about eleven months. When I went to the Hostel, Mr Mains was the person in charge and a man called KIN66 who helped out in the house. There was also a woman there the cook, I think her name was KIN292 I cannot remember who else worked there. I was there for about six months or something when I realised there was something wrong as far as Mr Mains was concerned. Very often when boys were washing, he would come into the washroom and put his arms round our chests and hold us tightly to him. Also sometimes as boys walked passed him in the home he would 'touch them up'. That is to say would touch their behinds with his hand. He did this to me personally on several occasions. This was what made me think he was 'queer'. He may well have said something as he did this but I can't remember now. One incident sticks in my mind, it happened one night when I was getting washed. I was in the washroom and wasstripped to the waist. Mr Mains came in. I was the only boy in the washroom at that time. Mr Mains came up to me and said, "Do I not get a kiss then?" I didn't answer him. He then put his arm round me and rubbed his hand up and down on my side from my armpit to my waist. As a result of family circumstances I was taken into care at the age of 10 years. I spent considerable time with foster parents in Bangor, Co Down. I can't recall where I was at the time but I can remember that I went into the Kincora Hostel at Newtownards Road, Belfast. This was only for a few days as an introduction to the other boys as it was arranged for me to go on the summer camp at Portrush. I was about sixteen - eighteen years of age I spent a few days in the Hostel before going on to the camp. I recall that Mr Mains and Mr Semple were in charge of the Hostel. I remember very little about these men but certainly they never interfered with me. When we went to the camp at Portrush there were a few other boys there all from the Hostel. We each had separate beds and nothing happened to suggest that there was any sexual interference among the staff and the boys. Some of the boys did suggest that Mr Semple was a bit queer and he certainly gave that impression in that he was a little effeminate. During the camp Mr Mains would generally leave in the van we had with us in the evenings. Occasionally Mr Mains and Mr Semple went off in the evening together. At the end of the two week camp we returned to Kincora where I only stayed for a couple of days before returning to my foster parents. I can only recall the name of

He didn't follow me to the bedroom. Because of the length of time and my age then I don't remember very much about Kincora. I can't even remember the names of the other boys that were there at that time.

When I was about ten years of age I was fostered to a home in Larne. There had been problems with my parents. Sometime during 1967 I was taken to the Kincora Hostel at Upper Newtownards Road, Belfast, as I was considered too old for the other home. I went to Kincora after July 1967 after my brother KIN 25 had left. During my stay at the hostel there were two men in charge, Mr Joe Mains and Raymond Semple. Two women assisted as domestics. My recollections of my stay at Kincora are rather vague though I never felt very happy there. I didn't like the atmosphere. Mr Mains was very over-bearing with the staff and boys. Mr Semple told me that Mr Mains was a queer and I felt certain that he was. Mr Semple also gave me the impression that he was a queer and he was a very effeminate type. 

I enclose a file containing a letter received by me on 23rd August, 1971, written by R8 who resided in Kincora from 29th April, 1968, to August, 1971. It was during this period that the alleged incidents would have taken place and the boy states that he wrote the letter two years ago.

Mr. Johnston the Deputy Town Clerk, together with Mr. McCaffrey, Assistant Children's Officer and I interviewed the boy on 23rd August. He did not appear to be a convincing witness but he reaffirmed all the statements made in the letter.

On 24th August Mr. McCaffrey and I interviewed R33 stated in the letter as having experienced the same approaches from the member of staff in question. R33 was a resident in Kincora from 1st July 1968 to 12th July 1971. He related that he had been asked by the member of staff to rub his back and then invited to stay the night in his bedroom. He refused end returned to his own room.

No other investigations have been carried out regarding the rest of the statements made, but it is thought that there are sufficient grounds to have the matter considered as one which should be referred to the Police in view of the allegations which were made against the same officer in September 1967. A copy of the results of the departmental enquiry into these allegations are contained in the file.

The officer concerned is not due back from leave until 29th August.

I am going on leave from 28th August but Mr. McCaffrey will give any further details which may be required.

I have been shown today a letter, exhibit No GC/24 (part of GC/1) the letter is dated 12.8.71 and is in my handwriting. I have also been shown a second letter, exhibit GC/19 (part of GC/3), which is virtually a carbon of the letter dated 12.8.71, and is again in my handwriting. The first letter I handed in for Mrs Robinson who was my social worker at that time who worked in College Street. I cannot remember the date I wrote this letter but the envelope is marked 12.8.71. The second letter I addressed to Mr Moore, again of College Street. I cannot remember exactly but I think he was the head of that branch of the Social Services. I have read both these letters today and the details in them are true. I wrote these letters just before my 18th birthday when I was due to leave the hostel. They were written because I felt that during the time I was there I had been treated with contempt by Joe Mains. The incident I describe in the letters relating to Joe Mains asking me to rub his back and to sleep in his bed

happened after I had been in the hostel for about a year. I did not report the incident until I was almost due to leave the hostel because I thought I would get in trouble if I made a complaint and still lived in Kincora. The incident happened at about 12.30 am to 1 am. I cannot remember now but Joe Mains must have asked me to rub his back earlier during the day. I think he said he had some muscular trouble. When I went to his flat the door was unlocked and I went in after knocking and Joe Mains coming to the door and inviting me in. This happened after the other boys had gone to bed. Mr Mains stripped to the waist and lay on his bed. I think he had kept his trousers on. He gave some ointment and told me to rub the lower part of his back. This I did. Whilst I was doing this he kept making grunting noises. He spoke to me while I was rubbing his back about an experience I had with R34 , the boy I shared a room with. As will be seen in my letter I had complained about R34 to Mr Mains. Mr Mains tried to make out I had made the approach to R34 him to me. I denied this and he dropped the conversation. I rubbed his back for a considerable time and then he said to me that it was too late for me to go upstairs to bed and that it would be safer if I slept downstairs with him. He also said that he would set the alarm clock so that the cleaner would not see me in his bed when she arrived the following morning. I also remember that he telephoned the GPO for an alarm call, the phone was beside his bed. I got into Mains bed, but I kept my jeans on, I can't remembe why but I suppose I must have been a bit nervous. Joe Mains got into bed next to me I think he kept his pants on. I lay and faced the wall, Joe Mains laid up close against my back and put his arm around my shoulders. I think it was then that he pushed up against me and started saying "On to it -On to it". I don't think his penis touched me but I remember that he had an erection. As far as I am aware, he never tried to undo or remove my jeans. I also remember that during this incident, Joe Mains kissed me on the lips. It was a 'French kiss', that is he put his tongue into my mouth. I remember this distinctly because I remember feeling the bristles on his chin scraping

In the letters I have been shown I said that I ran upstairs to my own room but in fact I slept in Joe Mains bed all night, returning to my own room just before the cleaner arrived at about 7.30 am. Other than what I have described nothing else happened to me that night. I can only assume that I stated in my letter that I had gone back to my own room because I was too embarrassed about the whole incident. Other than this incident Joe Mains made no other advances towards me, in fact he never mentioned the incident again. When Joseph Mains asked me to rub his back I had reservations about doing it, but the 5/- that he offered, tempted me. It was a lot of money to me at that time. Having written the letters I marked the one to Mrs Robinson "To be handed in at Central Police Station". I intended that this letter should reach the Police. I did not take the letter to the police because I thought my Social Worker would. This whole incident left quite an impression on me at that time, but I was at an impressionable age and was very annoyed, which was why I wrote the letters. As nothing happened after this one incident I did not ask my Social Worker to arrange for me to be moved to a different hostel, in fact after the incident I got on alright

with Mr Mains and I tried to forget the whole thing. The letter I wrote to

Part III Exhibit No GC/24 Part of GC/21 Pages 32 - 37 wrote two letters concerning this incident, he does not remember the dates, but one of the letters (Exhibit GC/24 part of GC/1) is dated 12 August 1971, and was also the subject of investigation by Mr Mason in 1971.

Exhibit No GC/19 Part of GC/3 Pages 82 - 86 149. Both the letters are almost identical and cover the incident described above. The first, GC/24, was to his Social Worker, Mrs Robinson, who at the time, worked in College Street. This letter 88 marked 'To be handed in at Central Police Station'. The second letter was addressed to a Mr Moore, who also worked with the Social Services in College Street at that time.

Part II Pages 42 - 43 150. Police enquiries have failed to locate the present whereabouts of Mr Moore. However Mrs Margaret Robinson has been interviewed and remembers the letter which R8 had sent to her. She states that she passed the letter to her superiors for investigation but cannot remember to whom this was. She showed the letter to Miss Eddis NICHOLL, her Senior Social Worker, who discussed the matter with a senior member of staff based at 16 College Street. Miss Nicholl cannot remember the name of the senior member of staff she told.

Page 43A

on 25 February 1980, Detective Sergeant Middlemiss found him to be somewhat 'strange' individual who in the opinion of the police would make a very poor prosecution witness should he be required to give evidence. He is a malleable individual and under pressure would undoubtedly change his story to suit his audience.

I am a journalist employed by the Irish Times, my office is at Fanum House, Great Victoria Street, Belfast. Just before the trial of Mains, Semple and McGrath in the Kincora affair in December 1981. I conducted some research for a background article which was published the day after the trial, together with a piece from David McKitterick. As a result of that research and as a result of a conversation held shortly thereafter with a particular source, I came to the conclusion that the affair merited further investigation. I then spoke to my colleague, Andrew Pollak to ask him if he would be interested in working with me on this. He agreed and I then contacted my News Editor, Mr Conor O'Clery, explained the position to him and asked for two or three weeks off normal work and for a relief replacement from Dublin, to allow the two of us to do the enquiry. He agreed and we started properly around Christmas. As a result of our research which was carried out in some cases individually and in others together, we published three articles in the Irish Times dated 12th, 13th and 14th January 1982. Regarding the article on January 12th, re the alleged 1976 prostitution ring, we were initially put on to the story by a social worker source. This source had come across the story by hearsay from a second more senior social worker source who had been involved in the case. Andrew went to see the second source who revealed to him, and broadly confirmed the story. This source also named a source in the RUC who I will call RUC Source 'A', who he said had further knowledge of the affair. We have consulted our sources since the start of our investigation, and . they re-confirmed that the information supplied to us and reported in 13th January article had already been communicated to the police during 1980. We contacted a social worker Source 'A' who we understand had not talked to the police before and we suggested that she should contact Superintendent Caskey. She was agreeable to this. The bulk of the article concerns the case of a former Kincora inmate Richard Kerr and the headline refers to the death of Stephen Waring. With regard to the reference to two other homes being unsuitable for Richard Kerr following his release from Borstal, we were told that one was the Westwinds Hostel and the second was an un-named home in the Craigavon area. The article on January 14th was entirely about the case of R8 who was interviewed twice by us once in his bedsitter and again in the Irish Times office. The second interview was tape-recorded and he gave us a photocopy of a letter which he said he had written in 1971 to send to the Press and which was similar to letters he said he had sent to the Welfare Authorities and to the police. On further enquiry we discovered that he had not personally sent the letter to the RUC but had handed it to someone else to post for him. Neither had he sent the letter to the Press. If required, and in the knowledge that R8 had no objection to us keeping and playing the tape to others, we would make this available to the police if necessary. Regarding the article in the Irish Times of the 4th February 1982, the information came from a police source except biographical details of Mr Whiteside. The information re dispute between RUC officers concerned, the case of Sergeant Jimmy Cullen, Donegall Pass RUC who, in 1973 as a result of a drugs arrest involving a Kincora boy, developed suspicions about affairs at the home. We were told that he submitted a preliminary report, which made its way to Assistant Chief Constable Billy Meharg. We were told that the two officer's versions of events agreed up to that point, and that Sergeant Cullen was instructed to investigate the matter further and submit a second report. Here the versions differ. Sergeant Cullen apparently has said that he submitted a second report to Mr Meharg but that Mr Meharg claims to have no knowledge or record of this second report. However, we were told that Sergeant Cullen "Has an ace up his sleeve" in the sense that he has a copy of that second report. All other reports published by the Irish Times were either a matter of public record or were as the result of a Press Conference and subsequent media interviews given by the Reverend Ian Paisley. During the course of our enquiries a social worker source who we shall call

social worker 'B' told us that a senior social worker, Gordon Higham, who had been told about suspicions of irregularities at Kincora had, upon taking the matter up with higher social services authorities, been taken to the Department of Health and Social Services Headquarters, Stormont, and had been shown a file on Kincora. Afterwards he had remarked to a close colleague of social worker 'B' that its content quote "would make your hair stand on end". He is also alleged to have said that he should keep away from Kincora because of the links with TARA for his own good. We interviewed Gordon Higham during the course of our work and put this to him. He denied it and said that the only file that he had seen was that which has since become known as the 'Harry Mason file'. Sometime after this we were told by other social worker sources that a departmental (DHSS) file on Kincora had been mutilated and sections removed. We were also told that the Eastern Health Board file on R23 had gone missing from Eastern Health Board Headquarters. We were unable to check any of this. I am now handing Detective Superintendent Caskey a three page document which I have been asked to exhibit as EGM1. I have signed each page of the document. I'm handing this document over for two principal reasons. The first reason is that two sources have told me that Hubert Nesbitt was an associate of William McGrath dating back to the 1940s and the 1950s and that at these times he was suspected of being a homosexual. The second reason is his relationship with senior policemen, including ACC Meharg. I would like to make it clear that the remarks in relation to Bill Mooney have absolutely nothing to do with this enquiry. The remarks re Blevins relate to a separate document, three pages which I'm now handing to D/Superintendent Caskey marked Exhibit EGM 2, with each page signed by me. I would like to make it clear that the document EGM 1 is based on my memory of the conversation with Hubert Nesbitt. I took notes at the time which are now I believe in storage with my furniture and personal effects. I am now handing over a document known as the Folio Document which I have exhibited as EGM3 (2 pages each signed). This document should be read in conjunction with all other documents I am handing over. These are as follows: - Exhibit No EGM 4 (1 page), EGM5 (one page report by Jack Holland), Exhibit EGM6 (one page report by David McKitterick in the Irish Times on 13.1.1977), Exhibit No EGM7 (one page headed further conversation with Mrs X - 2.2.1982), Exhibit No EGM8 (letter from McGrath to Reverend Paisley (one page dated 1.5.1977), Exhibit No EGM9 (5 pages headed material gleaned from talks with MrsX). Exhibit No EGM10 (4 pages headed "Typed up notes of conversation with source 'X' on 30.1.1982"). The two documents Exhibit EGM2 and EGM3 were both given

to me by a source known as Mrs 'X'. Relating to EGM3 first, there were two theories in existence at the time this document made an appearance in 1976/77. The first was that it was an attempt by members of TARA organisation to smear a number of individuals within the DUP and thereby divide them. The second theory is that the document was some sort of intelligence report written by William McGrath to someone in British Army Intelligence. There is no evidence for either theory except that when it was produced to Clifford Smyth prior to his expulsion/resignation from the DUP Dr Paisley is said to have said that he got it from a Stormont Castle source. This was current at the time and was repeated to me recently by one of those involved in Clifford Smyth's resignation. Another theory which was given to me by Mrs 'X' was that it was written and anonymously circulated by what she described as a political/paramilitary person on the Unionist side who in 1976 wanted to stop DUP plans for the 1977 Loyalist Strike. I could find no evidence to support or deny this or any theory. Exhibit No EGM4 is my typewritten note of a telephone conversation I had with a Church of Ireland figure on or about 4 February 1982. It was this figure who introduced Nesbitt in the conversation. Exhibit EGM5 is an article written by Jack Holland, published in the Hibernia on 4 February 1977. It relates in the main to the folio document Exhibit EGM3. You would need to consult David McKitterick about the article published in the Irish Times on 13.1.1977 which is Exhibited EGM6. The source of the documents Exhibits EGM7 and EGM10 were conversations with source Mrs X on 30.1.1982 and 2.2.1982. If we take Exhibit EGM7, the content is the result of telephone conversation with Mrs X. It relates primarily to the conversation she had had the previous night with a former member of the DUP. According to Mrs X this person had left the DUP because of McGraths homosexual activities. The names mentioned are Simpson Gibson, a poultry farmer in Newtownards. The KIN referred to KIN 399 originally from Ballymoney, County Antrim who was said to have lived in a homosexual relationship with John McKeague. He was charged and acquitted with McKeague for the 1969 explosion which precipitated the resignation of Captain Terence O'Neill. Mrs X first came across KIN 399in the Summer of 1969 when he was arrested for disorderly behaviour during disturbances in the Shankill Road area. I have checked to the best of my ability, the allegation that KIN 399 was a former Kincora boy and found no evidence to support it. The Gracey is I believe a Trevor Gracey who, if my memory serves me correct, was either charged with the 1969 bombings or some related incident. The Robinson is Peter Robinson MP. Exhibit No ECM8 is a letter from William McGrath on behalf of TARA to Dr Paisley on or around the eve of the 1977 Loyalist Strike. "The Exhibit EGM10 is based on notes of

first became suspicious of John McKeague's sexual inclinations, McKeague's
relationship with Margaret Miskimmons and his relationship with
KIN 399 . As a result of her suspicions she investigated this and
discovered a link between John McKeague and William McGrath in the context
of some sort of racket involving young boys. In particular, she remembers
one young lad who she declined to name other than he was called . I
understand that Andy Pollak may be able to provide more information on this.
Her conversation also outlined a link between a man called Alan Campbell who
was incorrectly described as a Minister in the Free Presbyterian Church,
but is a leading figure in the DUP. In particular she related one incident

The article titled 'Kincora complaint ignored for a decade' is solely concerned with the experiences of one former resident of Kincora, who although not named is clearly R8The evidence of R8 and in particular its relevance to the 'Mason file' is dealt with in paragraphs 94-119 supra. Suffice it to say that the press article is consistent with the evidence supplied by R8 to the Royal Ulster Constabulary investigators in 1980.

POLICE OFFICERS FRIENDLY WITH MAINS

1302. There is however just one quote in the third article which should be commented upon. It reads thus:

'He (R 8) also claims that it was generally understood by the boys that MAINS had friends in the police so there was no point in complaining' (SP EX 13)

1303. So far as MAINS personal involvement with the Police Service is concerned, he became a member of the 'B' Specials on 12th January 1948 at the age of 18 years, resigning from the Force on 12th May 1949. On 3rd October 1957, MAINS rejoined the Specials but resigned again on 14th September 1958, giving as a reason the existing conditions of his employment. He became the Warden of Kincora in January 1958, when the hostel first opened. (SP EX 21)

1304. I have already mentioned (paragraphs 1168-1169 supra) that a brother of Joseph MAINS served in the Royal Ulster Constabulary.

OV 2, who died in , is known to have visited the hostel to see his brother on at least two occasions, and since this close relationship between the Warden and the Royal Ulster Constabulary was known to at least one of the boys resident at Kincora, Hugh QUINN, it seems reasonable to assume that others knew of it too (SPS 9-12).

MAINS' early and brief service in the 'B' Specials nor his brother

1306. It is likely that much of the subsequent speculation on the subject of MAINS' connections with the police stemmed from the homosexual relationship he had with R2. The long-standing friendship between R2 and MAINS, R2 's very brief service in the Royal Ulster Constabulary Part-Time Reserve between 1977-1978 and his frequent presence at Kincora, as portrayed by the residents, is dealt with at paragraphs 10-11 supra and paragraphs 1148-1157 supra. R2 is described by some of the former

residents as a police officer and there is a suggestion that he may have visited the hostel in uniform on occasions. When, however, wrote his letter to the Social Services in 1971 (KI EX 32-37) complaining of, amongst other thirgs, MAINS' homosexual relationship with R2 the latter had not by then joined the Force.

desperate for money at the time of his interview with the journalist, was obviously grateful for the forty pounds which Mr MOLONEY paid him for the interview, despite the journalist's later protestation that it is not the policy of the Irish Times to pay for information (K2MS 293), and R8 says he advised Mr MOLONEY not to continue with the story of prostitution and vice at Kincora because he (R8) considered it to be 'a total fabrication' (SPS 300-302).

COMMENT

1309. No attempt has been made to trace and interview every police officer with whom MAINS may have been acquainted since there would appear to be little tangible benefit in doing so, and the effort required could not be justified on the basis of such a flimsy and non-specific allegation.

1310. It was a natural consequence of professional visits by the police to Kincora that MAINS should strike up a casual friendship with some officers, who like himself were members of the nearby Harland and Wolfe Social Club.

1311. Since the Kincora Hostel catered for adolescents, some with criminal convictions and most from problem families, it should come as no surprise that many of the inadequate and impressionable residents saw the frequent visits to Kincora by police officers, uniform and plain clothes, to deal with criminal matters, abscondees and general misbehaviour by the inmates as being evidence of collusion between MAINS and the police (SPS 64)(SPS 9-12)(SPS 275-276).

1312. In that sense the social stature of MAINS must have seemed unassailable to the boys and the comments attributed to R8 that there appeared to be little or nothing to be gained by lodging complaints against MAINS is probably a fair illustration of the residents' thoughts on the matter at that time. There is no evidence though that MAINS was ever able to use or attempted to use his acquaintance with members of the Force to avoid detection or exposure for his crimes or to nullify any complaints against himself.

When I was aged about sixteen years of age I ran away from home because I did not get on well with my step-father. I came to Birmingham at that time and after a short time I was taken back home and put under Welfare Care. I was under the supervision of a Mr Chambers, Welfare Officer. I remember that I was put into Kincora Boys' Hostel, Upper Newtownards Road. When I went into the Hostel the staff were Mr Joe Mains who was in charge and another man called Raymond Semple who was second in charge. I can't remember the names of the other boys who were there at the Hostel when I went to it about March 1969 I can only remember some of their faces. I can remember that there was general talk amongst the boys that Raymond Semple and Joe Mains were homosexuals but I can't recall any particular incident referred to by any of them. I remember I was quite friendly with Joe Mains and he used to let me use his flat to play records. At no time while I was in Mr Mains' flat did he interfere with me in any way indecently. I do recall one time I was with Mr Mains in his car. He was taking me for a run somewhere, I can't recall where. I remember that his car was a Hillman Minx, silver colour. There was just Mr Mains and myself in the car and as we drove along the road, I think now it was in the Dundonald area, as we were driving in the area of the Ulster Hospital, Joe Mains asked me to take hold of the steering wheel and to steer the car as we drove along. The only one of the staff I can remember was Joe Mains the Headmaster. The only other thing I can say about it is I remember one boy telling me that he thought a man called William who was on the staff was a bit queer. He did not tell me any details nor in fact I can't even remember this boy's name. I think I can remember the man called William but he never interfered with me in any way.

- 131. There is no evidence to show that anything improper took place during 1970 at Kincora although there is little doubt that MAINS' activities continued. The witnesses traced who had been living at Kincora during 1970 are KIN 34 (), 18 months residence, KIN 35 (), two years residence, and KIN 36 (), six weeks residence. They contribute little other than KIN 36's comments that there was talk that MAINS was a 'poof'. His comments concerning Brother Gabriel at the De La Salle home are dealt with separately (paragraphs 559-589).

I lived at home with my mother and elder brother at

until 1st April 1971 when my mother could no longer look after both of us due to a disability and I was placed in care with the Welfare. I was sent to Kincora Hostel, Upper Newtownards Road and slept in a bedroom together with two other boys. One was KIN 282 and the other called KIN 302 This room was directly opposite the assistant warden whose name was Raymond and the warden was Joe Mains. I stayed in Kincora for four or five months and left on 7th July 1971 when I returned to my mother. When I entered the Hostel the talk between all the boys was that Joe Mains was queer and that we had to watch ourselves. On about five or six occasions when I was going from the bedroom to the bathroom or the toilet normally dressed in my underpants, Joe would come along and pat me on the backside always keeping it there till I removed it. He normally would say 'hurry up' or come on, but always left his hand there. On one or two occasions his hand slipped inside the waistband of my pants but I pulled his hand out and told him to fuck off. Once I made my intentions clear to him he did not touch my backside again. On two occasions he ordered me to make his bed, he took me down to make it and whilst I was in the room which was part of his office, he had his hands inside the pockets of his trousers and was quite clearly

playing with his privates whilst looking at me. I could see from the front of his trousers that he had an erection, but at no time did he take his penis out of his trousers. I can remember that he said something to me that was suggestive but at the moment I cannot remember what he said. On the second occasion I started to make the bed up and he started doing the same actions again, so I refused to do any more and he ordered me to sweep the lawn instead. Whilst I was working in the garden I ran away from the Hostel and was later picked up by the police who were in uniform. I told them that they were all queer in the Hostel and they took me to my mum's address, they didn't seem to believe me. After the first time that I made Joe's bed and he was playing with himself in front of me I complained to my Social Worker at that time who I recall was a female that Joe was a queer and told her what had happened in the bedroom. She said she would look into it, but I heard nothing of what she did if any. This Social Worker left I think and a second female Social Worker took over and I repeated to her what had happened in the bedroom and Joe's behaviour in the Hostel. She smiled and seemed to laugh it off. She spoke to my mother that I had been telling lies about the staff and didn't seem to believe me. When I was in Kincora I was going out with a girl and this seemed to annoy Joe. One evening I came home late and Joe was waiting there with a cane in his hand' and told me to come into his room and take my pants down, so I refused and told him where to go so he just hit me on the hands with it. At no time during my stay there did I see any homosexual acts between the staff or any of the boys. At no time did I hear of any action or results of my complaints to my Social Workers, regarding Joe Mains actions.

disability he was taken into care on 1 April 1971 and entered Kincora Hostel on that date. He remained there until his discharge on 7 July 1971.

167. Although the file in this case is not available it has been established that Miss Eleanor SIMPSON was the Social Worker responsible for the KIN 27 family. She does not recall KIN 27 making any complaint regarding his stay in Kincora Hostel.

- 168. When interviewed by police on 17 April 1980 KIN 27 stated that Mains patted him on the "Bottom" on five or six occasions when he KIN 27 was dressed only in his under-pants. On one or two occasions Mains slipped his hand inside KIN 27's under-pants.
- Mains' bed. As he did so Mains stood beside him with his hands in his pockets and appeared to be playing with his penis and KIN 27 could see that Mains had an erection.
- 170. KIN 27 absconded from the hostel but was detained by uniformed police officers and returned there. He states that he told these officers "They were all queer in the hostel".
- 171. Despite enquiries the identity of the police officers has not been established.
- 172. Although KIN 27 insists that he told two Social Workers of his problems at Kincora, as already stated Miss Simpson his Social Worker does not recollect him complaining.
- 173. KIN 27 was not medically examined. A search of the various indices held at RUC Headquarters shows that he has a conviction for dishonesty and motoring offences.

I am a senior social worker employed by EH&SSB North Down and Ards District. Between 1969 and 1971 I worked in East Division, Belfast Welfare Department, as a trainee social worker. I can remember having the KIN 27 family on my caseload. I can also remember visiting Kincora but cannot remember whether or not it was in connection with KIN 27 To my recollection KIN 27 at no time made any allegations of either homosexual or physical assault. I can remember KIN 27 coming to see me in the office in Holywood Road by appointment. I can also remember visiting the family at home and KIN 27 being present. However, I cannot remember any visits to KIN 27 in Kincora Working Boys' Hostel. On any visit I made to Kincora I do not remember having ever had cause to suspect that homosexual activities were taking place or had taken place in the hostel. I may have had other boys placed in Kincora, howev I cannot remember this, nor do I remember any boys in my caseload making any allegations of homosexual activities in Kincora or any other hostel.

 KIN 27 s allegations of indecent assault, agreed that KIN 27

 may well have been required to make MAINS' bed but denied any improper behaviour. He was asked if he could identify KIN 27 s social worker but was unable to assist on this point.
- 140. The Royal Ulster Constabulary's detectives were unable to locate the police officers to whom KIN 27 says he complained in 1971. Detective Superintendent CASKEY recommended to the Director of Public Prosecutions (KIDPP 597 & 600 (18)) that MAINS be charged with indecent assault on KIN 27.
- view that MAINS be charged on this particular count, and one can well understand his reasons for taking this decision. In my view the evidence was unlikely to succeed in gaining a conviction because KIN 27 s complaint, canvassed by the police some nine years after the event, was denied by MAINS and the evidence of the witness SIMPSON would have tended to support the defence case rather than the prosecution case. Additionally, the police witnesses would have been obliged to concede that they could not locate any police officers who had received a complaint from KIN 27 in 1971.

It would have been late afternoon when the officers picked me up.

They were driving a Landrover but I am unable to give any descriptions of the men concerned. I would not recognise them now. Once I was in the vehicle the officers were going to take me back to Kincora but I objected. I told them that Mr. MAINS wanted me to help him make his bed. I told them that he had made me do it before and that each time he would watch me and play with his private. I also told them that he would try and knock me off balance so that I fell on the bed and he would then try and lay on me. The officers seemed to treat the matter as a joke and

there was left the possibility of calling KIN 27 as a witness to support other cases, and perhaps prove a consistent mode of conduct by MAINS or a systematic code of behaviour.

- 142. I do not imply any criticism of Detective Superintendent CASKEY, the officer in charge of the Kincora investigation, in submitting the proposed charge for the consideration of the Director of Public Prosecutions. This is a familiar practice within the Police Service. Had he charged MAINS prior to seeking advice, that would have been a different matter.
- Superintendent FLENLEY and I looked closely into the circumstances of KIN 27's complaint because it was the first occasion when the police were said to have been made aware of offences against boys at Kincora and allegedly failed to take any action. Superintendent FLENLEY conferred with Mr BURKE, KIN 27 s probation officer in 1971. He said the file on KIN 27 had been destroyed in accordance with their six year rule. KIN 27 had apparently visited the probation office on a weekly basis whilst on probation and resident at Kincora. According to BURKE, no complaints were made to him and he denied that he was even aware of KIN 27's habit of absconding.
- 144. Miss Eleanor SIMPSON was interviewed, but she could not tell Superintendent FLENLEY anything that she had not already told the Royal Ulster Constabulary detectives.

I have made statements to the Royal Ulster Constabulary and the Sussex Police about the time I was in Kincora. Apart from what I have already said I know of nothing else happening at the hostel involving either the staff or boys. I have explained my experience with MAINS but I do not know of any other boys being interfered with. I did not hear or see anything while I was there of prostitution or a vice ring which any boys were involved in with important people either inside or outside the hostel. I do remember on several occasions MAINS took a number of us out for day trips in the country in the Mini bus. Once it was to Newcastle. Nothing improper happened on those trips and we didn't meet anyone whilst on those trips. When I first heard of the allegations of prostitution involving boys from the hostel I couldn't believe it, Nothing like that was If it had been going on I would have happening while I was there. known because we all used to talk among ourselves about a number of things and something such as homosexuality involving the boys would have been mentioned.
