WITNESS STATEMENT OF	HIA 56	

I, HIA 56 will say as follows:-

Personal details

1. I was born on ______ in Belfast. I was placed in St Joseph's Baby Home on 5th March 1957. I think a priest in my mother's parish, Father _____ in arranged for me to be placed in care. He thought it would be in mine and my mother's best interests.

Nazareth Lodge (16/10/59 - 20/8/68)

- 2. I was placed in Nazareth Lodge from St Joseph's Baby Home on 16th October 1959 when I was two and a half years old. I was moved into a group called Bethlehem. I stayed there for about a year and then I moved into a group called Our Lady's. There were four groups with thirty boys in each Bethlehem, Our Lady's, Sacred Heart and St Joseph's. I was in the same group throughout my time in the Lodge. I stayed in Nazareth Lodge until I was eleven years old.
- 3. In the Lodge older boys who were in their late teens and early twenties went out to work during the day. When they came back to the Lodge they were in charge of groups of younger boys. These older boys were called 'charge boys'. They were in charge of us when the nuns went to the convent between 6pm and 9pm. A nun had a room called a 'cell' in the dormitory and she could look into the dorm

from her cell. The cell had a half wall around it and it was open at the top. The charge boys slept in another part of the dormitory.

SR 47 was in charge of my group. I thought she was very good. She never put a hand on me. I don't know if SR 47 is still alive. I think was also in Our Lady's group. We went to bed at 5pm SR 34 everyday and the nuns went away to the convent at 6pm. That is when the charge boys took over and they abused us. They were bullies. We were terrified of them. There were two brothers called DL 209 . On one occasion when I was about six or seven and they were fifteen or sixteen years old, the brothers made my group all line up - there was about twenty five to thirty in each dorm and they just lined us all up and we were told to take our pyjama bottoms off. Then they went along the line and touched everyone's penis until we got erections. Not everyone got an erection. If anyone got an erection and they would hang these flannels with loops on. Then they made us wiggle so the flannel moved and they thought this was hilarious. The charge boys were also physically abusive and they used to kick and punch us. DL 209 were bullies and they used to beat up a boy called I saw them hit and kick him. I believe the went to England and one brother committed suicide.

5. There was a man who was in charge of

Joseph's Baby Home. He was elderly, I think he was in his sixties then and he had white hair. I think his name was Latter I do not know his surname. The was sort of a friendly figure as he knew us as babies. I used to go over to see the staff as I always knew there were sweets there. When I was in Latter I locked the door and he took down my shorts and pants. He sucked my penis. He would have his trousers down exposing his penis and lower body. He sat me on his knee and his penis came up between my thighs. He made me touch his penis and he moved back and forward. He gave me Toffee Crisps and I ate the sweets while he was abusing me. I think he started to abuse me when I was about six years old. He abused me on a couple of occasions.

the sexual abuse by NL 116 I was about six or seven years old. It happened on a couple of occasions. He was called NL 10 He had dark hair and he was in his late twenties or early thirties at the time. He lived in NL 10 assisted NL 11 who was NL 10 took me up into his bedroom and he felt all around my penis. He made me feel his penis by grabbing my hand and placing it on his penis. I think his trousers were down. This occurred on several occasions. I didn't understand what was happening but I knew he would give me sweets for doing it.

8. I was abused by DL 269 and DL 231 When I was about 8 years old they were about 11 years old, maybe a bit older. One day they took me up on the stage in the hall where we watched TV. Furniture was being stored on the stage. They took me under a table and then they started to fight with each other. One said 'he's mine I had him first'. I think it was DL 231 that said this. Then they took my trousers and pants down and started touching my penis and testicles. I was really frightened. They both had their trousers down at the time but I don't recall them touching each other.

DL 269 told me I had the nicest bum in the home. I was also abused by DL 269 and DL 231 individually a few times around the henhouses. I was told by the police that DL 269 was arrested recently for sexual offences and I believe DL 231 ended up in

9. There were two civilian staff who worked in the Lodge. They were called NL 4

NL 4 and NL 5 They patrolled the dorms to check if you were asleep. I saw NL 4 hit people with her hand. NL 174 messed his


bed one night and I saw NL 4 rubbing his face in the mess. She made an example of him. NL 4 left the Lodge. Everyone was afraid of her and they cheered in the refectory when they saw her leave with her bags. However I knew to stay out of her way in order to avoid being beaten. On one occasion she called my mother a 'tart' and said 'who does she think she is?' and punched me on the shoulder.


- 10. During the holidays we used to stay with families. When I was about eight or nine years old I went out at Christmas to a family who had a son about thirteen or fourteen years old. I had to share a bed with him. He tried to force me to have sex with him. I remember crying and screaming. He was hitting me as well as doing other things. I don't know name of the family.
- 11. I remember the food in the Lodge was basic. We ate things like vegetable roll, fried bread and powered potatoes which came in big sacks. There used to be a market in the city centre called 'Mays market' and the nuns would go down two or three times a week. At the end of the day people in the market would give the nuns food. They were getting the leftovers from the market. Buns were also donated every Sunday by Kennedy's Bakery. I remember being hungry all the time. Sometimes we went down to the playing fields at the back of the home. We picked a green leaf from the hedgerows called 'salix'. You could heat the leaf on the radiator and eat them. They were nice.
- 12. I think a lot of the clothes were donated to the home. Also the toys at Christmas were donated. After Christmas the toys were taken off us and the nuns told us that they were being sent to the babies in Africa who really needed them.
- 13. I never had any complaints about the nuns. The nuns were good and I have nothing bad to say about them. I was happy with them. They made sacrifices for us. I just suppose they didn't see what was going on. Even today I really miss them. I have missed them since I left Nazareth Lodge.


- 14. I think it was hard for the nuns. I think they had very little state help, if any. They went out twice a week to collect money around the doors all over Belfast and the countryside. They used to bring the money back and we put it into bags for them. It was hard for them. They couldn't afford to feed us properly. They must have worked hard for us. We weren't aware of it at the time but now I realise the sacrifices they made.
- 15. I don't think the nuns were aware of what was going on other than that incident with NL 116 I talked to SR 47 about. Obviously there was nothing done about it at the time.
- 16. My mother came to visit me twice a week from when I was five until I left at ten. I didn't really see her as a mother, I was actually terrified of her. She had a boyfriend at that time called and the two of them used to come up. The problem was she brought a change of clothes with her and made me strip and then she washed me and put on clean clothes. She also brought me food like custard and stewed apple. She humiliated me as I got teased by the other boys 'your ma's here to strip you, it's time for your wash and your feed' and all this. I had to strip out in the gardens no matter who was looking. It was humiliating. This happened twice a week.
- 17. I later discovered that I was in care voluntarily and that my mother could have taken me out at anytime. She did not want me to be put up for adoption.
- 18. Once a week we had to do chores in the home. The floors in the chapel and the home had to be waxed. The chapel was on the first floor. Some boys had to put orange wax on the floor and then we put a blanket around our feet and ran up and down the corridors. It was fun at the time but you had to do it a lot. I also did the odd job in the kitchen and that allowed me to be up an extra two hours because I didn't have to go to bed until 7pm. I washed up and cleaned the floors and was allowed to eat snacks. The woman in the kitchen was called and she died a few years ago.


- 19. During every summer holiday we went away to an RAF base in Ballyhornan which was given to the nuns for the children. We stayed in huts. On a Saturday we were given a bar of red soap and told to go into the sea and get washed. I don't think there was any kind of baths then.
- 20. I left Nazareth Lodge on 20th August 1968 when I was eleven years old.





- 44. When I left Rubane I didn't see my mother until 1988 when she was dying. She was fifty two when she died. I wish I told her about my time in care but she was cold and I couldn't talk to her. After my mother died I found out that my father was called I don't know anything else about him.
- 45. I am currently unemployed and my goal is to find a job. I have retained my faith.

 I like Our Lady better than Jesus. It's hard not to keep a bit of it after all those years.

- 47. I have gone through life feeling sad and empty. I feel drained. I feel I have no worth, no value. I am lonely. I feel excluded and isolated. I wonder why I am different. I question 'is there something wrong with me?'. I am clamped to the past. I have no qualifications, no employment prospects. I feel completely and utterly contaminated by abuse. I am sexually disorientated.

 I feel destroyed and worthless. I avoid people where possible. I always try to please and pretend there is nothing wrong. I can't take the risk of letting people get too close. I feel afraid to trust. I am aware of the loneliness and isolation this creates. It is despairing but I feel safer.
- 48. I have no motivation to make progress in anything. I have never loved or been loved. Simmering beneath the surface I feel dangerously full of unexpressed rage and anger with a dreadful sense of hopelessness. I feel surrounded by unbreakable barriers. I feel perfectly justified in asking myself 'why the hell am I still on this planet?'.
- 49. Who were these people who decided my life and how it will be? Who decided my sexuality? Who denied me my human right to create a family of my own? Who were those people who failed even to provide a basic education and to prepare children for life outside the institutions. These awful decisions have created considerable misery for many and all for a few seconds of gratification.
- 50. I have now managed somehow to reach the age of 56 years old, perhaps partly due to the retention of my Catholic faith and the slight glimmer of hope I struggle to keep a hold of in the hope that things might get better. I can honestly say that

its not all doom and gloom. I have educated myself to a reasonable level with particular interests in English, Geography and History. I enjoy classical and Irish music as well as Irish art. I am very keen on furniture restoration and love gardening. I remain healthy, fit and active and humour plays an important part in my life.

- 51. I am prepared to whole heartedly throw every effort into changing my present circumstances and make a positive step forward because I want to prove that I am not totally useless. The best I can realistically aim for is to try at least to find worth and value and meaning in life and perhaps even happiness.
- 52. I have been fortunate enough to have recently started on a 'condition management programme' suggested by the Health and Social Trust' and through the efforts of my occupational therapist,

 I am already feeling the benefits. I also attend the Good Shepherd Convent and meet with

 She is very good and understands me perfectly. I feel quite content and comfortable in their presence and wish to continue with the programme.
- 53. I am painfully aware that none of us have experienced the supposed joy and innocence of childhood. I am aware that most of us live alone and have done so for a long time, depending on benefits. This is not right. We deserve better. I have had enough of dwelling deeply on my past. I want someone to look me directly in the face and say 'sorry'. I need that.
- 54. I made a statement to the police on 22nd February 1995. The police came back to me around 1998 and told me they couldn't take the case any further as there was no physical evidence. I was annoyed at this decision. I am the evidence as are other boys in my position. I had a solicitor at the time on Castle Street.



56. On 29th May 2012 I made a further statement to the police in Strandtown clarifying some points I made in my earlier statement in 1995. I gave my statement to Constable Singleton (service number

I em in receipt of your letter of 7th instant on the above. It certainly makes grim reading and as you say provides some ground for my suspicions. However, I really think there is little we can do for two reasons. Firstly, the evidence, however offered in good faith, is circumstantial and certainly one couldn't base any action upon it.

Secondly, the fact that he is a voluntary child ties our hands considerably. His mother is at liberty to take him from care at any time she chooses. Contra-indications would have to be very positive before we could ask the Welfare Authorities to take any action. I have discussed the matter with Mr. John O'Kane the Co. Antrim Children's Officer, and he confirms my opinion.

The only thing we can do at the moment is ascertain the mother's address and refer the matter to the local priest. Perhaps you could talk to HIA 56 on the first point and if you have any result you could let me know.

Meanwhile, I will 'phone to errenge a mutually soceptable time to go down to see you.

I suppose you have heard and have been changed. Would you mind if I brought their successors, Mother and to Mircubin? I would like them to meet you and, of course, they would like to see your chalets.

I'll be 'phoning you and we can talk about it.

When I was born, I was placed into Saint Joseph's Baby Home, Ravenhill Road, Belfast. I remained there until I was 5 years old. I was then moved to Saint Nazareth's Lodge, Ravenhill Road. This was in the same grounds as the Baby Home. When I became 11 years of age I was moved to the Boys' Home, De La Salle, Kircubbin, Co Down, in the townland known as Rubane. This as far as I recall was around the end of 1968. I recall on my arrival there I was made take a shower with other new who supervised us. We all got a BR 15 arrivals and it wa pep talk and told that we better tow the line or else. I should say that before I came to De La Salle I had been sexually assaulted by the maintenance staff at Nazareth Lodge. One of the men was called he was the gardener and lived on the premises.
